Parents praise their kids. Grandparents praise them more. Teachers praise their students. Coaches praise their teams. Praise is something we were born with deep in our spirit-man. It is an integral part of life. We praise what we value. We praise what we support. We praise what we love. But what about praises to God? Most would agree that He is what we love and value the most. So why is it so difficult for so many of us to praise Him? In Reflections on the Psalms, C.S. Lewis writes that praise is "inner health made audible". Isn't that beautiful? The first witnesses to Jesus' resurrection were headed one way — and then were so changed, they entirely changed life direction. After looking into the face of the resurrected Lord, they did a complete about-face and their whole lives turned to face a different direction.

That's what Jesus' resurrection does in the world now:

Resurrection changes a life's direction.

Resurrection reorients.

Resurrection reorients the hurt of this world in a different direction.

Resurrection is revolutionary because it changes our trajectory.

And it's when Jesus' still hanging on the cross that Jesus points that different direction. It's the point of Jesus's very last words.

Jesus' last words were not "It is finished."

He wasn't finished when He said "It is finished." The Word, who spoke 7 last lines on the Cross, still had 7 last words in His heart. The Dying God had one final thing left to say:

"Into Your hands, I commit my spirit."
