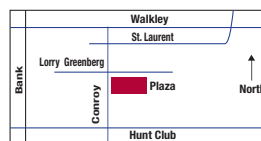

The Goal of a Neighbourhood Watch

The Hunt Club Park Community Association encourages other streets in the community to start a watch on their street and to con-

sider the merits. The goal of a Neighborhood Watch is discourage and prevent crime on our streets. Neighbourhood Watch is about getting to know your neighbours so that you are well positioned to notice suspicious individuals at your door or windows.

Eyes and Ears of the Community

Help Ottawa Police Officers patrolling in the neighbourhood as they may not recognize a stranger in your yard.

Operation Identification
When you become part of Neighbourhood Watch, you learn how to make your home less of a target for thieves. You can participate in Operation Identification, an engraving program to mark your valuables. You will also learn how to recognize and especially report activity in your neighbourhood to the police.
