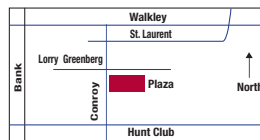
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Share the Road: Ottawa Police highlight e-scooter safety

It is summer and the Ottawa Police Service (OPS) is reminding e-scooter riders and the public about safety rules and tips:

- Ride in bike lanes or on the shoulder of a roadway, not on sidewalks. If riding on sidewalks, riders are subject to a \$150 fine
- You must be at least 16-years-old to use an e-scooter
- If under 18-years-old, you must wear a helmet. All riders are encouraged to wear helmets and bright and reflective clothing.
- E-scooters must have a bell or a horn, a white light on the front of the e-scooter, and a red light on the back (to be turned on at dusk).
- The same rules and fines apply for operating a vehicle on the road. Do not drive distracted and do not drive impaired.
- E-scooters are designed for one user at a time. You cannot have a passenger.
- E-scooters are not permitted on NCC cycling paths or in the ByWard Market.
- Drive safely and slow down near e-scooters
- Provide e-scooters with the same 1-metre distancing rule required for cyclists.
- Be courteous and avoid driving through puddles near e-scooters.

Greenboro Park:

- Monday – 11am to 6pm
- Tuesday – noon to 7pm
- Wednesday – noon to 7pm
- Thursday – noon to 7pm
- Friday – 11am to 6pm
- Saturday – noon to 5pm
- Sunday – closed.

The splash pads are open daily from 9am to 9pm until September 15th.

ASE Camera Replacement Measures for Blohm Dr

Through the Province's Road Safety Initiatives Fund, the City is proposing traffic-calming measures at former Automatic Speed Enforcement (ASE) camera locations and surrounding areas. For Blohm Drive, the conceptual plan includes four sets of speed cushions between Lorry Greenberg Drive and Woodbury Crescent.
