REDUCING VEHICLE THEFTS

- Residents are reminded to remove anything of value from their vehicle as thieves typically look for an unlocked vehicle. Once they gain entry, they go through the entire car, including the trunk.
- Download an AVR card (All Valuables Removed) <u>www.ottawapolice.ca/en/safety-and-crime-prevention/Prevent-Theft-From-Vehicles.aspx</u>. Display it in your vehicle on the inside of the driver's side window to display the message, "All Valuables Removed".
- Make the Right Call If you see suspicious activity, call


WARNING TO SENIORS ON DISTRACTION' THEFTS IN OTTAWA

- Ottawa Police are dealing with Distraction Thefts across Ottawa. Seniors are the main target but not exclusively. They occur near retail locations and tend to happen between 12:00 (noon) and 4:00pm. Suspects appear to work in groups of two or more (combination of male and female).
- Victims are approached in public areas and parking lots. They are offered a form of assistance (e.g. offering to help carry purchases; stating that the victim dropped money; or point out an issue with the victim's vehicle). While the victim is distracted the suspects steal their debit or credit cards.

TRAFFIC CALMING IN HUNT CLUB PARK

NEW TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES COMING

In our Winter newsletter, we indicated that residents would be kept updated on the City Staff's response to traffic concerns on Karsh Road, Johnston Road at Ewing Street, Johnston Road at Cellini Court (south

entrance), and Hunt Club Road between Esson Street and Blohm Drive. At the March 23rd Hunt Club Park Community Association meeting, City Councillor Deans confirmed that the community will see

• flex stakes - being reinstalled on Blohm Dr between Hunt-

erswood and Johnston. New flex stakes will be installed on Dossater between Swain and Esson.

- pavement markings slow/ lent marking will be painted on Karsh near Claudet and on Johnston at Ewing. As well, a Stop Ahead pavement markings will be painted on Cellini Crt at Johnston.
- speed board will be installed on Hunt Club Road between Esson and Blohm.



PLAYGROUND RENEWAL IN HUNT CLUB PARK

Hello Hunt Club Park Residents!

It's finally spring! Here is a quick look at what is happening in our community.

Spring Traffic Calming in **Hunt Club Park**

Traffic and Roadway safety is a paramount priority across the entire community. This spring residents in Hunt Club Park will notice several new traffic calming initiatives including new flex stakes, pavement markings, signage and a new speed display board.

Flex stakes are being installed on:

- Blohm Drive between Hunterswood and Johnston;
- Allanford Ave between Johnston and Upwood; and
- Dossetter Way between Swain and Esson

In addition to the flex stakes we will also be painting SLOW/LENT on Karsh Drive near Claudet Crescent and on Johnston Road at Ewing Drive. As well as, STOP AHEAD pavement markings on Cellini Court at Johnston Road. And finally, a new speed board will also be added on Hunt Club Road between Esson Street and Blohm Drive.

If you have any concerns about the proposed traffic calming locations, please let my office know as soon as possible. Flex stakes are planned to be installed in May, weather dependent, and removed sometime in November. If you would like to propose any new locations, I would be happy to include them in my list for review and consideration for the 2020 season.
