
The admission is FREE for everyone. There will be food, beverages and hot chocolate available for everyone for a nominal fee.

# IMPROVING SAFETY IN THE COMMUNITY

## **Traffic Calming** Measures in 2018

As you walk, cycle or drive through the streets of Hunt Club Park, you will see a range of permanent and temporary traffic calming measures put in place to reduce speeding and improve driver behaviour. Some examples worth highlighting are measures located in Hunt Club Park's school zones, near pathway entrances, and on main entrances to our community. In the school zones, seasonal flex-stakes, pole mounted speed display boards, traffic calming signage, and pavement markings are in place. Near the pathway entrance on Blohm Drive, between Picasso Drive and Winnegreen Court, a pedestrian crossover was installed. To slow traffic on Johnston Road, a digital speed display board was set up between Ewing Street and Cellini Court.

#### **Current Traffic Concerns**

Over the last few months, Hunt Club Park residents identified new traffic concerns on Karsh Road, Johnston Road at Ewing Street, Johnston Road at Cellini Court (south entrance), and Hunt Club Road between Esson Street and Blohm Drive. These traffic concerns will be reviewed by City staff over the next few months to determine the extent to which a traffic calming measures are required. The

Association will keep the community updated on progress and results of the review.

## Voice your **Traffic Concerns**

If you observe additional problem areas where traffic calming measures could make a difference, share your observations and concerns with Councillor Deans at a monthly Community Association meeting. These meetings are held on the last Tuesday of every month (except for July, August and December) at 7 p.m. at St. Thomas More School on Blohm Drive.
