CWC PATH

GOAL 1 – a full data set (qualitative and quantitative) of determinants we want to address

2025 – In collaboration with the United Way, BNRC and City of Brandon, the CWC continues to strive toward improved data availability that accurately reflects local demographics.

GOAL 2 – food and water available 7 days/week (food/water dessert elimination)

2025 – Building on what already exists, the CWC developed and regularly updates/distributes a Brandon Food Calendar; works collaboratively with partners to support water availability in warm weather months; and is working with the City of Brandon toward installation of seasonal water stations to be available in downtown Brandon.

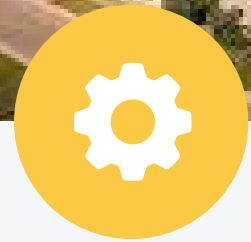
GOAL 3 – dignified and safe public washrooms available 24/7 (shared responsibility)

2025 – this is an ongoing discussion that has resulted in 2023 & 2024 pilot projects led by the City of Brandon and CWC Collaborators (shared responsibility); with much learned during pilot projects, we are pleased to share that the City of Brandon is working toward a new permanent washroom structure designed with safety and dignity for all top-priority.

GOAL 4 – working relationship with community

2025 – this is an ongoing endeavor of hearts, with new projects on the horizon; the CWC has community feedback boxes available at strategic locations throughout Brandon; several have gathered for Community Blanket Exercises, an immersive exercise that allows participants to learn about and gain a deeper understanding of the impacts of colonization in Canada and Manitoba for Indigenous communities.
