Who are the District 30 Umpires?

Little League District 30 Umpires is a group of like-minded individuals who are passionate about, enjoy umpiring, and want to provide a high-quality service to their community. We believe in the values of Little League: Courage; Character; Loyalty. Because we strictly umpire baseball/softball for our local Little League International district, we are a 100% volunteer umpire unit (we do not get paid). Through our local work and regional training, we have opportunities to be selected to even umpire at the Little League Regional and World Series levels.

Who do we umpire for?

District 30 Umpires service the 10 Leagues with the California Little League District 30: Anaheim Hills; Memorial Park; Northeast Santa Ana; North Sunrise; Orange; Santiago; South Sunrise; Tustin Eastern; Tustin Western; Villa Park

How do I become a district umpire?

The first thing you need to do is contact us and express your interest. We have local monthly meetings (see our calendar), all are welcome. As we are a 100% volunteer unit, there are no fees to being a district umpire.

What experience do I need?

Most of are umpires come from our local leagues and have been umpired before. We suggest that you start at a local league, but there is no real experience needed. Contact a local league for information on their umpiring program.

What are the requirements to being a District Umpire?

- Attend a minimum of 2 D30 Mechanics Clinics.
- Attend a minimum of 2 D30 Rules Clinics.
- Complete 2 mentored games (1 Plate and 1 Base).
- Attend Western Regional Weeklong Clinic at San Bernardino, or 2 weekend clinics at Western Regions.
- Complete a minimum of 75 volunteer Little League Majors Baseball games (documented).
- Complete a series of plates and bases games with Sr. Members (6 minimum).
- Complete a "rail-bird game" (watch a crew complete a little league game and take notes) and provide a review and give feedback. (need to see if you can evaluate other umpires).
- Display a solid knowledge of Little League rules and mechanics at the 60ft level (90ft is optional).
- Sr. Member committee then meet and decide if the candidate is ready.
- You need to commit to a minimum of 10 LL games a year.
- You need to commit to supporting our Trainings.
- Act professionally, hold yourself to a higher standard.

Are there any government requirements to being a district umpire?

All Umpires need to complete the Little League Background Check, and Live Scan (finger printing). If you have completed a Live Scan prior to joining our unit, you will need to complete the Live Scan again for Little League.

Do I need my own gear?

All umpires are required to purchase their own gear. We do not provide any gear for you. Gear can be purchased at www.gerrydavis.com and use the promo code of LLTEN for a 10% discount. Recommended gear: 1 pair of base pants; 1 pair of plate pants; 1 pair of base shoes; 1 pair of plate shoes; umpire mask; plate chest protector and shin guards; black hat (6 seam, no logo); plate brush; indicator; lineup card holder; signal flag; 2 umpire jerseys (1 black w/ grey panels. 1 blue w/ black panels).
