THE “SPIRIT” OF THE POOL RULES

1. **Absolutely no glass of any kind allowed on the pool deck or in the pool.** Even a hint of broken glass will require the pool to be drained, cleaned and refilled.
2. **Remember Your Neighbors.** Many 6000 Penn residents live in close proximity to the pool. Have fun but keep noise to a minimum. Please use earphones or earbuds when listening to music, videos and electronic games.
3. **Watch the Kids.** There are no Lifeguards on duty. Children under 12 must be accompanied by adults at the pool.
4. **Eat and Drink in Moderation.** Enjoy a beverage, snacks and light picnic fare at the pool and be sure to clean up after yourself. Large coolers, kegs, oversized picnic baskets, catering equipment, etc., are not permitted at the pool. **No eating or drinking in the pool**
5. **Don't Commandeer the Pool.** The pool cannot be reserved and is open to all 6000 Penn residents at all times. Enjoy the pool with your friends and relatives but don't intimidate others. Make all those wishing to use the pool welcome by letting them know your “gathering” is not exclusive. The 6000 Penn pool is not the place to hold the “Big Party.” Decorum and courtesy to your neighbors are the orders of the day at the pool at all times.
6. **Dawn to Dusk.** The pool is officially open from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. In reality, the pool will open well before 9:00 a.m. on most days and close when it's dark. Remember that chlorine and other chemicals are added as needed to the pool in the evenings when the pool is closed.
7. **Call 911.** Report drunkenness, loud, obnoxious, boisterous or inappropriate behavior to the police. All public displays of affection should be Rated “G”.
8. **Pool Toys.** All toys used in the pool must be bigger than a tennis ball so as not to clog the drains. Sorry, ladies, but the hardest things to get out of the bottom of the pool are bobby pins.
9. **Enjoy the “Spirit” of the 6000 Penn Pool.** Have fun at the 6000 Penn pool this summer by always remembering your neighbors and following the recommendations listed above. The 6000 Penn HOA Board of Directors would much prefer to enforce the spirit rather than the letter of the law regarding the pool.
