ARFAX History

"The idea for ARFAX originated in 1961 when a number of women at the various clubs in Arlington and Fairfax counties wanted to play competitive golf outside their own clubs, and District Golf Association had a maximum Handicap of 21. Ruby Angsten of Washington Golf, along with a small group of women from Army Navy, Belle Haven, Cedar Crest, Chantilly, Fairfax, International, River Bend, Washington and Westwood, had formed the "21 PLUS" group. They started talking about an organization similar to the District Golf Association for those women Golfers who did not qualify for the 21 HCP and under Rule. Thus, in August 1962, these women started ARFAX with 50 members." Source: Meeting Minutes of August 1962.

The first ARFAX tournament was played in June 1963. In June 2023, ARFAX celebrated the 60th Anniversary of that first tournament.

ARFAX has grown over the years and now includes 19 clubs in Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William counties.

Statistics

Our annual handbooks are a rich source of the over 60-year history of ARFAX. Each handbook includes the Members, Clubs, Teams, Officers, Committee Chairs, Delegates, and Alternates.

Our archives include handbooks for 1972 to 2025 but are missing the handbooks for 1980 and 1981. We have no evidence that there were handbooks from 1962 to 1971.


In 2025, our updated roster shows that ARFAX has 435 Members from our 19 Member Clubs, including 10 Past Presidents as honorary members. Over the years, there have been a total of 28 Member Clubs.

Some of the Clubs no longer exist and some are successors of earlier Clubs. For example, Lowes Island Club became Trump National Country Club and Woodlawn Golf Club became Mount Vernon Country Club.

The number of Clubs in ARFAX has varied from the original 9 Charter Member Clubs in 1961 to 19 Clubs in 2025. The average is 14 Clubs per year. Of the Charter Member Clubs, 8 of the original 9 are still ARFAX members.

Our membership increased from the founding 50 golfers in August 1962 to 435 golfers in 2025. The average is 306 golfers per year over the 50 years of handbook data.

The number of Teams has varied from a low of 12 Teams to a high of 30 Teams in 2025. The average is 14 Teams per year over the 50 years of handbook data.

There were Herbert Strong, Donald Ross, Algie Puller and Richard Mandrell redesigns. There are now 27 holes in Arlington.

In 1958, the Club bought the Fairfax Country Club with its Robert Trent Jones' course. After changes made by Algie Pulley and face lift by Richard Mandell, there are now 27 holes in Fairfax.

Its challenging 18-hole layout lies on the shores of the Potomac River just between Alexandria and Mount Vernon. The annual Belle Haven Four Ball tournament features some of the best golf in the area.

This hole is a par 4 that plays 240 yards from the Gold Tees. There are a series of sand hazards halfway up the right side of the fairway. But the real challenge is climbing the hill to the elevated kidney shaped green that is flanked by two deep sand traps. It is a classic Arthur Hills finish to a challenging round at Belle Haven.

In 1947, twenty Fairfax residents formed a private club. A dairy farm was converted to a golf course. Courthouse Country Club was named for the historic Fairfax Court House. Four holes were opened in 1948 and expanded to nine holes in 1949. A second nine was added in 1954. A new Clubhouse, a pool, and tennis courts were built in 1955. In 1958, the course was revised when more land was added. The club became the Country Club of Fairfax in 1963.

Its golf course is a masterpiece taking advantage of its rolling hills flanked by stately oaks and maples. It is a true embodiment of the traditions and challenges of a classic golf course.

The remaining 27-holes followed in 2005 when Greg Norman designed an 18-hole course of his own, in addition to a 9-hole short course. The Golf Club at Lansdowne is attached to Lansdowne Resort, providing a first-class experience to its full golfing membership and resort guests.

Variety is plentiful at Lansdowne. With 45 holes to choose from, you will never get tired of the 3 distinct layouts. The RTJ II Course is played on Zoysia fairways, with a scorable front 9, and a back 9 which plays much more difficult through woods boasting vast elevation changes. The Norman course on the other hand plays much flatter on Bent Grass fairways. The Norman course runs along the Potomac River and brings a lot of water and marsh land into play throughout your round.

The fairway funnels downhill to an uphill green that is heavily guarded by bunkers on the left. If you have under 200 yards into the green, a long-mid iron approach up the bottleneck to the green will leave you an excellent chance at eagle or birdie. Be aware of the false front as balls that are hit on the front on green will roll off down the hill.

Golf has been an integral part of Springfield Golf and Country Club since its founding in 1960. The 18-hole, 71 par, 6,609 yard championship golf course was designed by Ed Ault and Al Jamison. Well-groomed fairways and greens keep the course difficult but friendly.

The course is a challenge for golfers of all abilities. Good shots and sound judgment will help you navigate this test of golf.



The Washington Golf Club began in 1894. It is considered to be the oldest golf club in Virginia. Most of its land was bought from Admiral Rixey (Surgeon General of the Navy and physician to Presidents William McKinley and Theodore Roosevelt).

Nine holes opened in 1909. Another nine were added in 1910. Donald Ross redesigned the course and some of those holes remain. The club was renamed Washington Golf and Country Club in 1915.

More land was bought and a new course, designed by Walter J. Travis, Hugh Wilson and William Flynn. was opened in 1922. In 2020, Tom Doak completed the first major course renovation since 1922.

The creek crossing the fairway puts a premium on course management. The green approach must carry over or to the left of the right bunker. The creek across the fairway and the pond along the right side requires thoughtful play. The multi-level green rewards accurate approach shots and demands putting accuracy and good distance control. The clubhouse rotunda in the background frames the rear of the hole.
