Next Labor Day's 2020 Treffen will be much closer (driving distance) to home so please consider joining us in Cleveland, OH. A Very Well Attended—Schlachtfest November 18th!

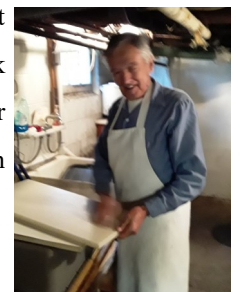
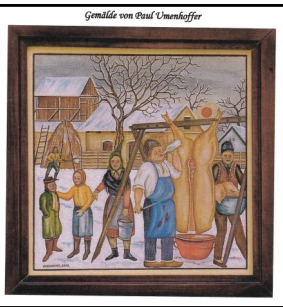

Welcome to Schlachtfest!

Our club carries on the Schlachtfest or “butcher’s festival” tradition that has deep roots in the German speaking areas of southeastern Europe where ethnic Germans called “Donauschwaben” once thrived. In my home town of Bukin, virtually every family owned a pig they fed generously all year long. After harvest time, the family’s attention turned to this nicely fattened animal whose turn it now was to provide life sustaining meat products for the coming year. Usually an experienced person from the village would be hired to manage the process with assistance from the entire family and anyone else they might get to help. Killing the pig was not for the faint of heart it’s fair to say and perhaps not nearly humane enough by today’s standards either. A group of men would have to catch and hold the squirming and squealing animal. This wasn’t easy at all and the excited pig would often bounce one or two right into the manure pile before it could be brought under control. The wild scene caused all of us to watch in horrid fascination. The death blow (a piercing of a main artery) had to be done accurately to capture the animal’s blood for later use. It was then time to drop the pig into scalding water to facilitate the removal of its hair. Every now and then the pig, who was supposed to be quite dead, wasn’t quite so. Out of the hot water it would jump and around and around it would run. The uproar and turmoil this caused was epic. Eventually the important work of processing the many parts of the pig would get underway. Produced would be everything from sausages to lard to bacon, and so much more. As important as it was for the food it produced, the event was also a social event for the hardworking German families from Hungary, Romania, as well as Yugoslavia with its Viovodina region which is where I come from. Good food and drink, as well as a sense of camaraderie bound family and friends together in a way that benefitted everyone including the community as whole like little else could. It was one of the high points on the yearly calendar back then just as it is for our Donauschwaben club today. All of the Schlachtfest specialties you enjoy today are the delicious results of our members very best efforts over the last three days. The event remains a living reminder of the way things were back in those wonderful towns and villages along the Danube River we once called home. 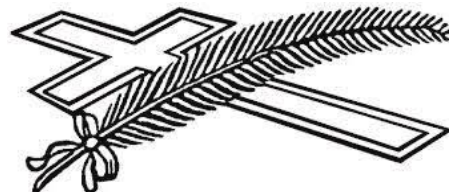

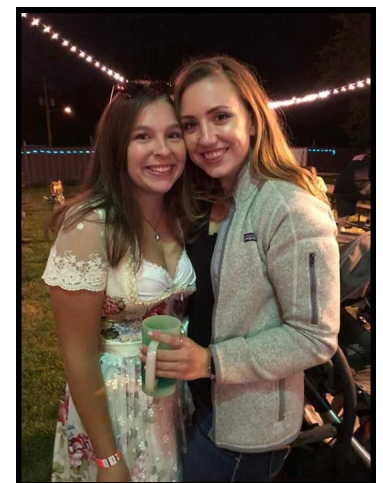

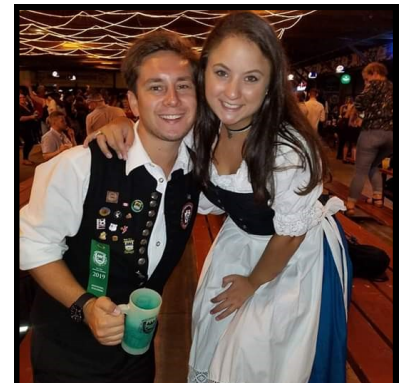

- Drain radiator
- Flush thoroughly
- Check rubber hose
- Refill with anti-freeze
- Check heater hose
- Check heater
- Check for draughts

Terry's Service Center Winter Auto Tips

Inspect operation of wipers and change windshield wiper blades before Winter

Clear obstructions (ice and snow) on windshield and head/tail lights before driving

Slow down in inclement weather

Top off all fluids (wiper washer reservoir, radiator, oil)

Check engine hoses

Use regular headlight setting in fog, not high beams

Go out only if necessary in foul weather and when visibility is good

Check tire pressure monthly in cold weather and for wear condition, replace worn out tires for better traction and wear

Carry ice scraper, car emergency kit (blanket, flashlight, energy bar, etc.) and some cat litter (traction if stuck)

Wash car as needed to reduce salt buildup and its impact on cars paint and frame/body




