

# NH Family Caregiver Support Program

#### **ADRD (STATE FUNDS)**

- Adult family members or other informal caregivers 18 years of age or older, providing care to a person with Alzheimer's disease
  or a related dementia may be served regardless of the age of the person with dementia
- The care recipient can no longer follow through after cuing

#### **Title III-E**

- Adult family members or other informal caregivers 18 years or older providing care to an individual 60 years of age and older
  - The care recipient requires assistance with <u>at least two ADL's</u>
- Grandparents and other relative caregivers 55 years of age or older providing care to children (under 18 years of age) may receive services
- Grandparents or relative caregivers, or parent providing care for adult children with a disability who are over 18 years of age
  - Caregiver must be 55 years and older
  - Priority is given to caregivers providing care for an adult with severe disabilities.

## MEDICAID

### **Choices for Independence Waiver Information**

- The Choices for Independence (CFI) Waiver provides a wide range of services designed to enable eligible individuals to remain in their homes and stay active in their communities. (Adults participating in the CFI program must be at least 18 years of age, be eligible for Medicaid, and meet nursing facility level of care). Some of the supports that the CFI Program could provide to an individual include (but are not limited to):
- In-home services to assist with eating, bathing, dressing and other personal care tasks, as well as general assistance with household tasks and preparation of nutritious meals
- Medical equipment and home modifications to support independence
- Respite care
- Participant-directed and managed services
- Supported employment
- Some respite can be provided
