Maurice Calvin Williams was born on September 19, 1959, at the University of Michigan Hospital in Ann Arbor, MI, to James Williams and Juanita Williams. He was the sixth child of nine siblings. As a child, Maurice displayed unique qualities and a glimpse of genius. He enjoyed playing Tonk and Monopoly with his siblings and entertaining the family with his Smokey Robinson renditions. Maurice attended Willow Run Public Schools, graduating in 1978, and remained an integral part of the community, earning recognition throughout Washtenaw County. During high school, he actively participated in football and basketball and admired the teachings of the Nation of Islam. While Maurice was not associated with a particular religion, he was more interested in spirituality and the total truth. Maurice was not only a philosopher but also a forward-thinker and master conversationalist.

As a young adult, you could always find Maurice riding around in his red convertible Renault Alliance. In 1988, Maurice encountered the love of his life during a serendipitous meeting at a friend's house while selling products for the Nation of Islam. He showed his entrepreneurial chops early on because he was able to sell Shonda his products and himself. They exchanged vows on October 29, 1988, and from their union, they were blessed with five children, raising a total of six.

While employed at the University of Michigan, Maurice acquired the skills necessary to establish his own business. In 1995, he co-founded Superior Cleaning, Inc., a 29-year venture he successfully managed alongside his wife. Additionally, Maurice pursued other entrepreneurial endeavors, including a t-shirt line reflecting his passion for motivating and inspiring others.

With a fondness for technology, Maurice consistently embraced the latest gadgets and trends, including his e-bike, which he rode daily throughout Ypsilanti and Ann Arbor. Known for his impeccable fashion sense, he often sported the sharpest and most colorful suits, complemented by his remarkable collection of alligator shoes, earning him the moniker 'gator man.'

While devoted to providing for his family, Maurice also prioritized enjoyment in life. Together with his beloved wife, Shonda, he explored various destinations domestically and internationally, he was particularly drawn to large cities. You would always hear him say, "I like cities, big cities, like Miami, New York, you know? Cities". In addition to traveling, Maurice embraced a healthy lifestyle, sharing his wealth of knowledge on nutrition and exercise with others, leading by example and motivating without judgment.

Maurice cherished spending time with his family, enjoyed moments at reunions and backyard barbecues, sharing his wisdom and everlasting smile. His legacy lives on through his family, friends, and those who he shared inspiration with daily, particularly through his Facebook posts. In the insightful words of Maurice, "I will think with you again, down the road at Godspeed."
