

Definition of Terms

Prayer and Praise: Overcoming Power

Prayer: Man's Communication with God.

Supplication: A cry of mercy (I Kings 8:28; II Chron 6:19, 24, 35. Asking humbly; Beseech (Beg)

Petition: Request addressed by men to God (James 5:16; I Peter 3:12)
Appeal to a higher power

Intercession: Pray for others: (Greek) to light upon a person or thing as if by chance; Sort of unrepentantly. ***When someone flashes in the mind, pray for them.*** (I Kings 18:36, 37; Matt. 5:44; I Tim 2:1)

Praise: Praise is the act of the will. "I will bless the LORD... (Ps. 34:1)

Hebrew Terms:

Halal: Hallelujah (Praise the LORD or Praise YAH (Yahweh of Jehovah) be boastful, excited, or to enjoy.

Yadah: To give public acknowledgement to (Extended hand or throw put the hand) to worship with raised hands (II Chron. 20:19-21)

Barak: Bless the LORD (Bow or kneel before Him). We bless him by not forgetting Him or His blessings.

Zamar: Touch the strings (Instrumental worship, Ps. 150)

Shabach: (Ps. 117:1) To speak well of; address in a loud tone; to command triumph, glory; to shout (Ps. 63:3 – 4)

Towdah: Related to Yadah, involving extension of hand in adoration. Used to thank God for the things that have not yet happened and for those things already completed (Sacrifice of worship)

Tehillah: Singing our Halals (Hallelujah) Ps. 22:3, 11 Chron. 20:22: Special singing unprepared or unrehearsed songs (Singing in the Spirit).

Ruah: Shout in joy (Ps. 100:1)

Thanksgiving: Relates to God's deeds (What He has done)

Praise: Relates to God's character (Who He is)

Worship: Relates to God's Holiness
