- This show is NWHA Versatility sanctioned on Friday and Sunday. Must be a member of NWHA to obtain NWHA points.
- This show is also affiliated with the TWHBEA International High Point Program, and is a World Series Regional Double Point show. All current TWHBEA members who are owners and riders may qualify, and points will be based on your results from our show. Please see the official International High Point Program rules for details.
- Divisional Classes:
  - o Non-Trotting Pleasure = Open to any gaited horse. Judge to call for trail walk, pleasure gait. Registration papers not required.
  - ADP / CP / TP/ Lite Shod / Plantation Pleasure = Flatwalk and runningwalk (pleasure gait and extended pleasure gait for ADP).
     May not cross enter into Non-Trotting Pleasure. Classes follow WHOA rule book.
  - Racking Classes = Judge to call for trail walk and slow rack. May not cross enter into Non-Trotting Pleasure. Classes follow WHOA rule book.
- Attire = All classes optional tack English or Western but not a combination. Show is casual. Collared shirt, long pants and boots with heels required. Tack should be in clean, well-maintained condition / show tack not required. Costumes encouraged.
- 2 Gait / 3 Gait = All classes 2 Gait unless otherwise noted as 3 Gait. 3 Gaited classes will call for a canter/lope.
- Beginner = Horse or rider has not won first place in class/event.
- Novice = Has not won more than 3 first places.
- Versatility = All versatility classes to follow WHOA rule book.
- Equitation = Patterns mandatory, and are available on our website. Beginner equitation- no blue ribbon in any equitation class for rider. Stock seat will be asked to do 360 turn on haunches, walking seat will be asked to address the reins. Riders cannot cross enter between 2g, 3g, beginner. Beginner in Western tack can use two hands.
- Bareback Horsemanship = Equitation bareback open to amateur, youth and professionals.
- Panty Hose Race = Timed event. Partners hold panty hose by feet proceed to the end of the arena, around a barrel and back to start.
- Pleasure Pairs = Partners perform pleasure gait, extended pleasure gait and trail walk side by side. Judge looking for the best matched team that properly rides in unison.
- Double Rider = Partners switch rider of the horse upon reverse. Pleasure gait, extended pleasure gait and trail walk.
- Bareback Pleasure = Trail walk, favorite gait.
- Beginner Western Riding / Western Reining = Open to horse or rider who have never won a blue ribbon. Riders are allowed to ride with two hands in a shank bit and do simple lead changes vs. the ideal flying lead changes.
- 11 & Under = Helmets required.
- Gambler's Choice = Points are assigned to certain obstacles; riders are given 60 seconds to gather the most points using whichever obstacle order they choose. Obstacles can be ridden multiple times but cannot be ridden back to back.
- Timed Water Glass Relay Race = Timed event. One partner holds water glass and leads horse, on foot, to end of the arena. Second partner mounts horse, and returns to entry gate with water glass. Placings will be determined by the average of time and amount of water spilled.
- Groom's Class = May not compete in other classes. No entry fee.
- **High Points =** High point awards are per horse/rider combination.

"All Horse" Fee - \$250 per horse (open to any riders, all classes included) Camper - \$45 / night; Camper w/ sewer - \$55/night Stall - \$100/weekend; Shavings - \$9 per bag (2 bags included with stall) DQP Fee - \$15/day Office Fee - \$20/horse Grounds Fee - \$20/horse
