⁷The LORD said to Moses, "Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; ⁸they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it, and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!'" ⁹The LORD said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. ¹⁰Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation."

¹¹But Moses implored the LORD his God, and said, "O LORD, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? ¹²Why should the Egyptians say, 'It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth'? But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, ¹⁴and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁵The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. ¹⁶But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. ¹⁷To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

Call Committee Selected

During our budget process earlier this year, we included a line item for a "Ministry Associate," realizing that our ministry at Crossroads Parish went much more smoothly with an extra ministry professional helping lead. Marty Wyatt served in that very part-time role

until his ordination in March--and since then, the church leadership teams have been in active conversation about how to move forward with filling the role of Ministry Associate. After much prayer and discernment, we are excited to share that our Church Councils have elected 12 members to serve on the Call Committee to discern whether the role of Ministry Associate will be filled by calling a part-time Deacon to serve our Crossroads Parish. Included in the Call Committee from Cross of Glory are Gretchen Davis, Marie Thomalla, Brianna Thomalla, Ron Markham, Brian Kaden, and Rochelle Benson; from Atonement are Adam Vasel (chair), Steve Klaers, Cheryl Lunde, Scott Carlson, Carreen Houfek, and Jim Nelson. Since we are conducting a targeted search, this process has moved more swiftly than we'd anticipated over the past couple weeks. Watch the bulletin, the newsletter, and your email for updates on the process--and most of all, please pray for this committee and our congregations as we discern together.
