I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' ⁵So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶He answered, 'A hundred jugs of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' ⁷Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' ⁸And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted

shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. ⁹And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes.

Call Committee Selected - During our budget process earlier this year, we included a line item for a "Ministry Associate," realizing that our ministry at Crossroads Parish went much more smoothly with an extra ministry professional helping lead. Marty Wyatt served in that very part-time role until his ordination in March--and since then, the church leadership teams have been in active conversation about how to move forward with filling the role of Ministry Associate. After much prayer and discernment, we are excited to share that our Church Councils have elected 12 members to serve on the Call Committee to discern whether the role of Ministry Associate will be filled by calling a part-time Deacon to serve our Crossroads Parish. Since we are conducting a targeted search, this process has moved more swiftly than we'd anticipated over the past couple weeks.
