# **Pastoral Delivery**



Hello Siblings in Christ,

Another month has flown by and here I am writing to you again: preparing for the season of Lent and hopefully some warmer, sunnier weather. Looming larger in my mind is Daylight Savings Time, which will

make Sunday mornings feel much earlier to me when on **Sunday, March 9th, we will need to "spring" our clocks forward by an hour** to make sure we're on time for worship. Even if you show up late to worship that day, we will be glad to have you!

Turning our attention toward the season, as you probably know by now: **our 2020 Lenten theme is "Less is More."** As some of us have experienced, by giving something up for Lent, we just might become more aware of our patterns, routines, and agendas in life. The hope is that we also remember that we belong to God. We also add a few things during Lent: a Wednesday evening Soup Supper at 6pm followed by a simple worship service at 7pm. Our two congregations join together in worship on these Wednesdays--and we encourage you to invite neighbors and friends to gather with us in worship.

Our hymn of the season of Lent will be **#616** "Jesus, Remember Me." This hymn comes to us from the Taize Community in France, a destination where people "search for communion with God through community prayer, song, silence, personal reflection, and sharing." I pray that this song helps you to reflect on your own life and draws you closer to God.

With the sometimes frenzied pace of the world constantly nudging us to move through this life quickly--and to do more, be more, acquire more--we know from scripture that Jesus invites us to something different. We are to be present in our lives: to seek out those who are in need; to take time for Sabbath rest; to dwell in scripture and to wonder together about where God is leading us.

May God bless us as we slow down together, taking a break midweek to break bread together, to sing, to pray, and to be in community as we walk through Lent together.

# **Growing Through Loss – Support for Those Experiencing Loss in their Lives**

**Growing Through Loss** is a grief and loss support ministry jointly sponsored by the North Suburban Grief Support Coalition, of which 19 churches and organizations in our area are members. The coalition hosts two six-week series each year at various locations that address both the educational as well as support aspects of a variety of loss and grief issues.



The spring series will be held on Monday evenings, April 13<sup>th</sup> through May 18<sup>th</sup> from 6:45 p.m. – 9:00 p.m., at Nativity Lutheran Church, 3312 Silver Lake Rd NE, St Anthony, MN 55418.

Each session offers an educational presentation by a professional from the community, followed by peer support groups facilitated by leaders who understand the grieving process. Each session is complete in itself, so you may attend any or all sessions. Registration takes place the evening before each session. There is no cost, although donations are welcome. ### **Carol Uecker**

My name is Carol Uecker and I was born and grew up in North Minneapolis. I graduated from North High. After high school I worked for the Bell system and retired from AT&T Company with 30 years of service.

I am blessed with four children, nine grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

My hobbies are crocheting, embroidery, coloring and singing. I sing with the Kitchen Kut Ups of New Brighton.

I joined Atonement in 1963. My faith has grown through the years through worship, choir, women's retreats, women's bible study and Caring Community program.

# **Marilyn Nelson**

I've been a member at Atonement since 1976; my family (2 sons) grew up here. I worked full time in adult education until my retirement in 2006. In 2006, my husband's memorial service was held here. I like to sing, teach children and enjoy square dancing and my 5 grandkids.

I was raised in a Christian home and the Presbyterian Church: enjoyed choir, camp, and youth group, was baptized and confirmed. When I was confirmed, I felt a bit guilty, because I really wasn't sure **what** I believed about God, but everyone else was getting confirmed, so.....

Things got really confusing at age 18, when I left family, friends, and Minnesota to attend college. I felt very alone and God seemed far away. He didn't fit **my** idea of an all-loving God. If He didn't **make** bad things happen to good people, He allowed evil to win. Since God didn't obey **my** rules, I stopped attending church and experimented with different spiritual practices and beliefs, finding none satisfying.

But God didn't forget about me. In the next 10 years of seeking, He kept putting me in touch with loving believers and sacred writings. Each opened my heart a bit more. One day, a friend said her faith and church helped her get through tough times and asked if I'd like to stop by one Sunday. There I met God and accepted that His ways are beyond my comprehension. I let Him out of the box and it's been an exciting ride.

# **Thoughts on Becoming a Parish**

Forming a Parish has been a learning experience for us all at Atonement and Cross of Glory and we've been figuring things out as we go along. As you can image, for a Pastor with two congregations comes many, many emails, texts, phone conversations, in person conversations, home and hospital visits and meetings. Did I say meetings? And then of course, planning worship for two congregations with different styles and building relationships with two congregations.

As two-point Parish congregation members, we can do our part in remembering that our Pastor is only 20 hours per week at each church and it won't look the same as having a full-time pastor. We need to think about where her time is best utilized with us? Do we want her spending her time on non-pastoral issues or do we want her using her time for planning our worship service experience to bring us closer to God, to connect and prepare our youth to be faithful servants to God and to help us connect and serve our communities?

It's more important now than ever, to step up to organize and do the work needing to be done for our churches so that our Pastor can do what we called her to do. It's critical for our leaders to streamline meetings, dates and times so our Pastor can spend her evenings and days off with her family so she can come to us refreshed and effective.

We, as members of a two-point Parish, have to remember what affects one church affects the other as our Pastor is part of both. As we are getting to know each other more, we must remember to care for each other as if we were one congregation.

Becoming a Parish is new to us all and *change is necessary* for it to work and for us to survive in an increasingly difficult time for churches. As we try to streamline the daily operations of both churches, please try to be receptive of the change that it brings.

As Atonement and Cross of Glory continue to work together, worship together, build relationships with each other and share resources, please keep in mind our ultimate goal is to get outside our walls and do what Jesus calls us to do; to share God's love and serve each other, our neighbors, our communities and those in need.
