This month we have much to celebrate. Yes, this is the "season of gratitude" as we approach our national holiday of Thanksgiving, so it is only appropriate that we give thanks to God! "Thy Holy Wings" is sung to a Swedish folk song. The words of the song were first included as a "Children's Evening Prayer" in the book *Cross Flower*.

The song's text recalls biblical images: Psalm 91:4 inspires the opening: "He shall cover you with His feathers, and under His wings you shall take refuge." (NKJV) Another image in the hymn comes from Luke 13:34, "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing."

"I chose this song because I learned it years ago when I was teaching it to Sunday School children. It has stuck with me and became a lullaby for my children over the years. I hope you enjoy it as much as I have." - Pastor Cassie

Feed My Starving Children

Twenty-seven members and guests of Cross of Glory and Atonement heeded the call to feed hungry children on Saturday, October 12 at the Feed My Starving Children warehouse in Coon Rapids. We scooped dried veggies, vitamins, soy granules, and rice into plastic bags, weighed the bags, sealed them, and boxed them for shipment around the world. In addition to our volunteers, there were about 70 other volunteers, including a Boy Scout Troop from New Brighton and a bachelorette party group! All together, we made 20,736 meals—which will feed 56 kids in the Dominican Republic for a year.

The Atonement Charitable Giving Team donated \$200, which was put in the contribution container by Leah Fabian.
