Pastoral Delivery

"We are all one in Christ, we are one body, all one people, out of many./Somos uno en Cristo, somos uno, Somos uno, uno solo." -We Are All One in Christ, ELW #643

For the past few weeks, this song has been running through my head. It's so simple, but its words hold power. I feel it is an appropriate hymn to hold close to my heart these days; as I help our two congregations unite as one in Christ.

I've especially found strength in the words of the song as these past weeks in worship we've reflected on the parables of Luke's gospel, during which we've been stretched and encouraged to see life beyond our understanding; to look at our lives through God's eyes. God's priorities are different than our own. We are to reach beyond what we can imagine and to keep our eyes open for places we can serve as God's instruments of hope and love. Where is God leading us?

Our parish has discerned that God is leading our congregations to be woven together and made stronger by that bond. Keeping this in mind, the Parish Board has agreed that modifying our bulletins and newsletters to match more closely. This will help us communicate schedules for both congregations and to grow a healthy relationship between Atonement and Cross of Glory.

Since the beginning of our parish agreement, this relationship has been described as a "marriage" of the two congregations. We are together in ministry, working as a team and in our individual worship services. Like any marriage, this relationship takes work--and it is worth it. In the past 5 months, we've managed to share an outdoor worship service, a hymn of the month practice, attending a Twins game together, and a Blessing of the Animals hosted at Atonement. Later this month we will combine forces to host a **Trick or Treat (or Trunk or Treat) event at Cross of Glory on Tuesday, October 29th** and on **November 3rd Bishop Patricia Lull will preach at both of our worship services**. As we continue our work together, may God continue to bless us and our wider community by our partnership. We are indeed all one in Christ!

Meeting Minutes

Atonement Lutheran Church Congregational Meeting Minutes (Unapproved)

September 15, 2019

<u>Devotion</u> - 12:15 call to order. Andrea accepts motion from Janice Schmidt to accept agenda as presented. Lindsey Fabian seconds. The motion carries unanimously. President Andrea Weatherly provides a devotional prayer to start off the meeting.

<u>Approval of January Minutes</u> – change date on document from 2018 to 2019. Ray Lucas moves to approve minutes with corrected date. Bonnie Anderson seconds. The motion carries unanimously.

<u>Reports</u> –recognition of contributions recent current and future for multiple positions and groups.

Elections

Tony Houfek from the Nominating Committee presents Lindsey Fabian as a nomination for Council. Lindsey accepts. After the President called for nominations from the floor for the required third time, Wally Billington moves nominations cease. Second by Tanner. The motion carried unanimously. Marilyn Nelson moves to suspend the requirement for a written ballot. Cheryl seconds. Motion carried unanimously. Lindsey is invited to leave the room during the vote. Election vote is taken by show of hands. All votes in favor. No votes against. Unanimous. Lindsey is elected to Council.

Unfinished Business

Membership Updates – In Reach Team is working on this.

Parish Board –Council is managing via a continuing resolution. 3 members to the Parish Board will be from Atonement. Tanner from Council, one member elected by Council and one alternate from Council.

New Business

Sidewalk coming – The city has proposed installing a sidewalk along Silver Lake Road from the corner of Rice Creek up to the Nystrom facility on our side of the road. In exchange for our easement for the sidewalk, the city will install a 6ft privacy fence for Kings Kids along the street side of the outdoor playground. The city will be responsible for snow removal from the sidewalk. Atonement will be responsible for the grass between the sidewalk and the street. So far this has been a proposal only. Details will be shared as available.

Scott Carlson makes recognition of Andrea Weatherly having extended her duties as President.

Pastor Cassie announced Tony Houfek as new Custodian.

Bonnie Anderson discussed Nystrom people are parking in our lot. Discussed Monday in Council. We are working to negotiate a financial arrangement with Nystrom. We used to have an agreement but it has not been observed in awhile.

Bonnie Anderson announced Kings Kids has a new director Charlie Warner. He has officially accepted the position.
