FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

When Heart of The City was formed in 2019, area demographics showed us that there were needs in our neighborhood and surrounding area, but we did not grasp the full extent of those needs. We wanted to provide help, meaningful help. notjust do what we thought was needed. Our business plan was flexible so that we could respond to needs as they were identified. Our first project was a free clothing event which was met with great response, thus confirming the need for clothing.

Through North Texas Food Bank, we learned that 1 in 6 people in Denton County were food insecure and were being served by only a handful of pantries. Partnering with NTFB, the Heart of The City Farmers Market launched on October 28, 2019, just in time to prepare for the surge to come as a result of COVID. And surge it did. The number of neighbors grew from just a handful on the first day of operations to over 250 in a day. In addition, we have been able to stock the patio shelves with food for people who are reluctant or unable to come during operating hours.

Based on the response to our initial free clothing event, Heart of The City opened a free clothing boutique in 2021. Through generous donations of new and gently used clothing, neighbors are able to shop for clothing for men, women and children. HOTC realizes that appropriate clothing is so important in building confidence at work and school, and this ministry continues to bless people every week.

Finally, Heart of The City offers life skills coaching on an appointment basis. We focus on loving, respecting and praying for every person who comes on our campus. As relationships are formed, Heart of The City becomes a trusted advisor and resource.



Heart of The City has a small permanent staff and large volunteer base. We are structured to be able to meet needs that are identified in our service area which has resulted in opening 2 satellite locations with more on the drawing board.
