29% of Denton Country Families live paycheck to paycheck- teetering on the brink of crisis. Heart of the City works to help bridge the gap for families to succeed in our community.

In January 2021, 69.9% of children in foster care in Denton County were placed outside of the county due to shortage of foster/adoptive homes within the county.

Heart of the City participates in a coordinated effort to assist our homeless by providing fresh food, clothing, personal hygiene kits, fresh showers and emergency assistance when needed.

Nearly half of Denton County's homeless population lives with a serious mental health illness.

Denton Country is home to over 41,000 Veterans, many who experience PTSD or poverty. Heart of the City works to aid Veterans by providing professional counseling services in addition to meeting immediate food and/or clothing challenges.

Since the pandemic, 34% of Veterans suffer from moderate to severe depression; 30% reported having suicidal thoughts.

Over the course of a year, 1 in 5 Denton County residents will be impacted by a mental health condition. Heart of the City works to advocate for overall mental health in our community by partnering with Logos Counseling Services, LPC.

The largest provider of in-patient mental health services in Denton County is the County Jail. Texas ranks near the bottom for access to mental health care.
