APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mayor Cranford called for a motion to approve the minutes of the September 8, 2022, regular meeting. Motion made by Jason Irby, second by Willie Moss, to approve the minutes of the meeting. Everyone voted in favor of the motion.

1. Jefferson County Invoice for Elections:

Motion made by Willie Moss, second by Christopher Whipple, to approve payment of the invoice from Jefferson County Board of Commissioners in the amount for \$3,471.70 for conducting the November 2, 2021 election; the November 30, 2021 run-off election; and the March 15, 2022 special election. a. Repair Invoice(s) for Trucks:

a. Quote for Flashlights:

Motion made by Jason Irby, second by Christopher Whipple, to accept the quote from FireLine, Inc. in the amount of \$1,665.00 for nine (9) Streamlights. The vote was unanimous.

b. Quotes for Cleaning Fire Department Floors:

Mayor Cranford presented two (2) quotes for stripping, waxing, and buffing the tile floors in the fire department:
