Mayor Cranford called the meeting to order and rendered the invocation.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:

Mayor Cranford called for a motion to approve the minutes of November 20, 2025, regular meeting. Motion made by Christopher Whipple, second by Janice Holley, to approve the minutes of the meeting. The vote was unanimous.

1. LMIG 2026 Project estimate by Brian Usry

Estimate from Brian Usry to replace 40ft of pipe on School St of \$15,500. Price includes digging up and hauling off old pipe, replacing with new pipe, covering and patching the road with concrete. Motion was made by Christopher Whipple, second by Phillip Beckworth to approve and move forward with LMIG 2026 project. Motion Carried. Not only would this project include replacing this culvert but also resurfacing 1600 ft of North School Street from the Main Street intersection. This would be a 3 year project.

2. Estimate from AW Electric for generator

Mayor Cranford presented the council with the estimate received from AW Electric in the amount of \$130,500.00 for a new portable 100kw generator and \$78,000.00 for a refurbished 80-125kw portable generator. City will continue gathering quotes from other electric companies.

3. Purchase of Air compressor approval for well

Motion made by Janice Holley, second by Christopher Whipple to pay \$1,096.49 for air compressor to replace irreparable compressor at School Street well and \$164.99 for 4-year warranty. The vote was unanimous. The Tank Maintenance Fund will be used to cover cost of the Air Compressor.

4. Buddy Contracting proposal for School Street Well

The well at School Street has a broken valve, Filtronics, Inc. along with Buddy Contracting sent a proposal of \$1,995.00 for parts. This includes valve and components to get the well functioning properly. The Tank Maintenance Fund will be used to cover cost. Motion made by Christopher Whipple, second by Phillip Beckworth to approve proposal and move forward with parts purchasing. All voted in favor.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business, motion made by Janice Holley, second by Christopher Whipple, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously and the meeting closed in order at 6:20 PM.
