

11 General Orders to the Sentry

Preamble – "Sir/Ma'am, the ____ order to the sentry is..."

- **1.** Take charge of this post and all government property in view.
- **2.** Walk my post in a military manner, keeping always on the alert, and observing everything that takes place within sight or hearing.
- 3. Report all violations of orders I am instructed to enforce.
- 4. Repeat all calls from posts more distant from the guardhouse than my own.
- **5.** Quit my post only when properly relieved.
- **6.** Receive, obey, and pass on to the sentry who relieves me, all orders from the Commanding Officer, Command Duty Officer, Officer of the Deck, and all officers and petty officers of the watch only.
- 7. Talk to no one except in the line of duty.
- 8. Give the alarm in case of fire or disorder.
- **9.** Call the Officer of the Deck in any case not covered by instructions.
- 10. Salute all officers and all colors and standards not cased.
- **11**. Be especially watchful at night, and during the time for challenging, challenge all persons on or near my post, and to allow no one to pass without proper authority.

Basic Drill

Facing Movements: Two counts are in all facing movements Quick Time: 120 steps per minute, 30 inches (heel to heel)

Double Time: 180 steps per minute, 36 inches (heel to heel)

Slow Time: 60 steps per minute, 30 inches (heel to heel)

Parade Rest: Left foot smartly moved to the left by 12 inches

Unit Leader: Positioned "six and centered" on stationary platoon; while marching: anywhere they can best control the platoon without passing center

Inspection Arms: Five counts are in Inspection arms

Uniform Measurements

Males:

Name Tag $-\frac{1}{4}$ inch centered above the right breast pocket

Ribbons – ½ inch centered above the left breast pocket

Females:

Name Tag – 6 and ¼ inches from shoulder seam to bottom edge of name tag on the right side of the shirt.

Ribbons – 6 and ¼ inches from shoulder seam to bottom edge of the ribbon rack on the left side of the shirt.

Both Genders:

Rank – 1 and 7/8 inches centered on the right collar

J-Bar – 1 and 7/8 inches centered on the left collar

Service Stars – ¼ inch above the top row of ribbons

Garrison Cap (Anchor) - 2 inch centered from the fore crease on the left MARINE CORPS side: 1 ½ inches from the bottom

Medals - ½ inch below the ribbons on the wearer's left breast

Male Hair – Should be tapered around the ears and neck; May not touch the tips of the ears or the collar and should be no longer than 4 inches in length and 2 inches in bulk; Sideburns cannot extend past the middle of the ear; Hair on the back of the neck must be shaved above the bottom of the ears.

Female Hair – Must look like a natural hair color and be pulled back into a bun, ponytail, single braid, or cut short. Buns need to be gelled back so that there are no bangs or stray hairs. Ponytails or braids must not extend past three inches below the bottom of the collar. Short hair must also be neatly gelled back, and cannot extend past the bottom edge of the collar.
