1. Introduction

The Battenkill race, organized by Anthem Sports, is a professional and amateur road cycling event attracting cyclists from all over the world. This technical manual aims to provide detailed guidelines, rules, and regulations to ensure the smooth functioning and fair conduct of the race. Participants are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the contents of this manual to enhance their preparation and adherence to race protocols.

2. Race Categories & Awards

The Battenkill race features multiple USAC categories & Gran Fondo age groups to accommodate various skill levels and age groups.

- 1) Battenkill Finisher medals are provided to all Full, Mid, and Mini Gran Fondo participants.
- 2) The USAC categories include:
 - a) Men's Elite / Pro.1.2
 - b) Women's Elite / Pro.1.2.3
 - c) Junior Men & Women 10-12, 13-14, 15-16, 17-18
- d) Masters Men 40+, 50+, 60+, 70+
- e) Masters Women 40+, 50+, 60+
- f) Men Cat 3,4
- g) Women Cat 3/4
- 3) The Full Gran Fondo categories include the following for both Men & Women:
 - a) Under 18
 - b) 18-29
 - c) 30-39
 - d) 40-49

- e) 50-59
- f) 60-69
- g) 70+
- 4) The Mid & Mini Gran Fondo categories include the following for both Men & Women:
 - a) Men Overall
 - b) Women Overall
- 5) Awards:
 - a) 1st Place Verge Champion's Jersey + Custom Chocolate Milk Bottle by Battenkill Valley Creamery
 - b) Places 2-3 Custom Chocolate Milk Bottle by Battenkill Valley Creamery
 - c) A sample Champion jersey will be provided for the awards ceremony. Champions will be provided access codes by Verge Sport to order specific sizes.
- 6) Participants must be present to receive awards. Awards will not be mailed.
- 7) The 15 min protest period applies for USAC Categories.

d) USAC Category 5 racers start with the Gran Fondo Full & will be provided a front-row start. Separate Category 5 awards are not provided.

5. Course Layout and Specifications

The race courses are designed to provide a challenging yet rewarding experience for all participants. **See enclosed maps and above schedule.**

- Course features: The courses feature a mix of paved & dirt roads, direct passes through villages & hamlets, bridge crossings, various railroad crossings, and a technical finish in the Village of Cambridge.
- 2) Course directional signage will be located at every turn or critical intersection on the course.
- 3) Area Law Enforcement and traffic control will be present at critical intersections on the course. Proceed with caution through all intersections & obey Law Enforcement.
- 4) Start: There is a 1 mile / 1.6 km Neutral start through the Village of Cambridge. **Do not pass pace car.**
- 5) Finish: Riders and racers will have the full width of the road from 1 km to the finish line. Please be aware that local residents will be periodically ushered to and from their driveways on these streets.
- 6) Feed Zones / Aid Station Locations

6. Rules and Regulations

Held under USA Cycling Permit. All USA Cycling Rules apply.

To maintain the integrity and fairness of the Battenkill race, participants must adhere to the following rules and regulations:

- 1) Registration: All participants must register online before the race prior to Thursday, May 8, 2025 at 11:59 PM. On-site registration is available up until 30 minutes prior to individual start times.
- 2) Race Numbers: **USAC racers will be issued 2 numbers. Numbers must worn on the back left & back pocket of your jersey.** Gran Fondo numbers must be attached to the front of your handlebars. Racers must not tamper with or alter their race numbers.
- 3) Starting Protocol: Participants must arrive at the starting line at least 30 minutes before the scheduled start time.
- 4) Center Line Rule: All riders must remain to the right of the center of each road throughout the course. All Gran Fondo riders and all USAC Category racers out of contention must stay to the right near the road shoulder to allow auto traffic to pass.
- 5) Drafting: Drafting is permitted within the same race field but not between different fields in USAC category races. Drafting is unrestricted in the Gran Fondo fields.
- 6) Aid Stations/Feed Zones: Designated aid stations and feed zones will be available. See enclosed maps and locations. Trash must be disposed of in receptacles provided. Littering will result in immediate disqualification. People supporting gran fondo riders and USA Cycling racers must park fully off the course on intersecting side roads only.
- 7) Support Vehicles: Official support vehicles will be provided. SAG vehicles will transport participants who are not able to complete the event & their bicycles to the main parking area from the course. Personal or team support vehicles are not allowed on the race course to support riders.
- 8) Public urination and public nudity are crimes. Violators will be prosecuted and disqualified from the race.
- 9) Penalties: Any violations of the above rules may result in penalties, disqualification, or suspension as deemed appropriate by the event officials.

7. Equipment Regulations

Participants must comply with the following equipment regulations:

- 1) Gran Fondo Bicycles: Bicycles in good operating condition are permitted.
- 2) Helmet: Helmets must meet USAC standards and be worn at all times during the race.

- 3) Clothing: Refrain from loose clothing. Personal clothing items should not obscure race numbers.
- 4) Accessories: Aero bars or clip-on bars are not allowed for safety reasons.

8. Important Area Conditions

Battenkill returns only with careful consideration & approval of the local communities where it resides. When you registered you acknowledged the following additional conditions for the Event:

- 1) Participants racers must yield to Emergency Vehicles at all times by pulling to the side of the road and coming to a complete stop until the Emergency Vehicle has passed, no matter the position on the course.
- 2) No littering of any kind. Immediate disqualification will result.
- 3) Participants must be alert to all farm equipment and slow-moving vehicles along the course routes and understand many of these pieces of equipment do not have turn signals. Furthermore, operators may not be able to see cyclists coming from behind their equipment.
- 4) We also ask that competitors be made aware of several Amish families that live in our community who ride our roads on horse and buggy that may have limited visibility towards what may be coming from behind them. Please be cautious and courteous of them and their horses.
- 5) Participants and spectators must not deface local roads with paint or markings of any kind.
- 6) Penalties: Any violations of the above regulations may result in penalties, disqualification, or suspension as deemed appropriate by the event officials

9. Medical Support

The health and safety of participants are of paramount importance. Medical support will be provided at various points along the course, including:

- 1) First Aid Stations: Located at the Feed Zones and in designated support vehicles.
- 2) Mobile Medical Units: Equipped to handle emergencies and provide immediate care.
- 3) Emergency Contact: Participants are advised to carry a mobile phone with the emergency contact number provided by the race organizers.

10. Parking

- c) All participants must use designated parking or use any legal parking spot
- d) Participants parking illegally or in undesignated parking spots will be towed.











JUNIORS 13-14









