WCEA Accreditation

We also have to look for areas of improvement to enhance student learning, ensuring sustained viability and vitality. All this information must be put in a self-study along with evidence being uploaded into a data library. The committee chair will be Ms. Karen Barreras, who will travel from Reno, NV. The visit committee will consist of three principals and a teacher from other schools within the

Archdiocese of Santa Fe. Our school's previsit is scheduled for February 2, and our accreditation visit is scheduled for March 5-7, 2024.
