# Saint Mary's Catholic School—Where New Mexico Students Rank at the TOP

Every spring, just like in public schools, Saint Mary's takes a standardized test to make sure our students are achieving. Our 2013 May test scores indicate that not only are Saint Mary's students making the grade, nationally, our students are scoring well above the average. When our 8th graders leave us for high school, they are going into advanced high school classes. Several of our graduates have been Valedictorians at their high schools in recent years. We do the same short cycle reading and math assessments that many New Mexico public schools do throughout the year. These also show our students average far above the predicted year end growth per grade level for New Mexico kids. The reasons for our successes are many. Saint Mary's offers a curriculum that is now aligned to National Common Core standards with a faith base fully integrated in every subject. Besides daily religion, math, language arts, science and social studies, our curriculum offers computer, PE, and art regularly, and this year, a new Spanish Arts, Language, see pg. 2

Teachers at Saint Mary's have been recognized by the Archdiocese as outstanding instructors. Most recently Ms. Charlene Baca, first grade teacher, was awarded 2013 outstanding teacher by the NM Catholic Foundation for her innovative classroom strategies. All teachers are highly qualified and 75% have advanced degrees.

Classes are small at Saint Mary's. Most classes average fifteen students and we have a cap of 20 to 22 depending on grade level.

The biggest reason why our students do well is because the formation of a Catholic identity is important and our parents want their children to have that relationship with God while getting the highest quality of education possible for their children.
