Saint Mary's Enrollment Up for 2015-16

At press time, the enrollment for the school is at 150, a number this school hasn't seen in several years. The growth is being attributed to the word getting out about the wonderful environment offered at our school. The time spent in classroom instruction has remained solid and consistent over the years since schools in the Archdiocese are not affected by testing requirements that keep public schools scrambling. The Archdiocese of Santa Fe uses one nationally normed assessment that takes approximately one hour per student three times a year with immediate results. The teachers at Saint Mary's are highly qualified and love teaching at our school. That satisfaction is passed down to the children in their classes. Expressing our Catholic identity every day through prayer and religion class, Saint Mary's is experiencing a rise in enrollment and some classes are already filled.
