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GIRLS ARCHAEOLOGICAL DIG TO BEGIN JULY 11TH

Beginning July 11th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grade girls from St. Mary's will get their first experience digging into Belen's roots. Through a grant with the American Association of University Women (AAUW) Community Action Grant for Girls in Archaeology, professors from UNLV and other universities will be sharing their summer jobs with our students. The girls will learn how to ask scientific questions and answer them with the empirical data that they collect, learning how to systematically collect data, learning how to apply basic mathematical methods to their observations and data collection, and learning how to be a cautious and critical thinker. Paired with a PhD student, teams of 2 girls will start the week by framing a hypothesis regarding the area of the site they are working on, and in the course of the week, they will gather enough data to be able to accept or reject their hypotheses. Their skills in writing and critical thinking will be enhanced with several short reports that they will produce on their finds from the excavation plot that they work. Drop by the corner of Wisconsin and Compana on July and watch what they are doing.
