St. Mary's middle school language arts program uses Wit & Wisdom curriculum. This curriculum centers on the study of rich and engaging texts (not basals), curated to build student knowledge and important ideas in the liberal arts and the sciences. The approach is integrated and text-based: daily reading, writing, speaking, listening, grammar, and vocabulary study is based, and draws evidence from, exceptional texts. Lessons list aligned standards for each assessment. Students will be held accountable for what they know and what they can do. The best assessments mirror the work students will do in college and their careers, allowing them to perform their learning in authentic contexts. Focusing Question Tasks, Socratic Seminars, & End-of-Module Tasks are designed to elicit the kind of performance, giving students the opportunity to show what they can do by applying their learning to solving academic, intellectual, and real-world problems.
