'TIS THE SEASON

It's that time of year when schools begin their standardized testing. What that looks like at Saint Mary's and what it looks like at a public school is quite different. Unfortunately, in regular public schools, where success has come to be almost totally defined by numbers, from August till now there is little time for anything but test prep. When the test finally arrives for public school students, the atmosphere is strained with rules and regulations about what can and can't go on in the classrooms during the testing. In my last year as a principal at a public school, I was forced to *investigate* three classroom teachers because parents called and reported that their children observed "abnormalities" from the teacher during testing. Apparently a teacher had tapped on a desk indicating that a student had answered incorrectly. Turns out the teacher had incidentally tapped her pencil in a ticking motion that disturbed the child. In the other cases the teachers asked the students to check answers before handing it in— supposedly implying that they had incorrect answers. This was illegally "helping" the students and deemed an irregularity thus not allowed. It's no wonder that teachers are terrified and students are feeling it.

One week in April Saint Mary's will take the ITBS test. It will be a normal week for our students. They will read and answer questions in all subject areas. We will have our scores before school is out, and we will look at how our students performed and where we need to adjust our instruction. Then we will go on with our instruction until May 22nd with an emphasis on developing the whole student. With high-quality teaching in an atmosphere that supports order and educational achievement, our scores will rise the traditional way. And we will continue to study science and social studies, learn cursive writing, make sculptures in art, demonstrate our Catholic faith, make muffins in culinary arts, serve our community, and we will sing.
