Team of 4 riders @ £22 per rider / £22 per class for Individual riders.

(Entry fees include paramedic fees).

All entry fees must be paid by no later than: **Tuesday 5th May.**

All horses & ponies must be entered under their passport name.

2026 BRC Competition Pass

The OBRC committee have agreed to pay for these passes to help club members with their total entry fees. The passes cost £30 per member for 12 months & will be allocated to any members who wants to compete in Area 6 qualifiers in 2026.

Volunteer helpers OBRC will need to provide one non competing helper per team or 4 individuals at this competition. If you are willing to spare half a day to be a volunteer helper for show duties, please contact Anka. Thank you in advance.

Details of heights and eligibility rules for horses & riders in each class.

The qualifiers consist of both teams & individuals for all height levels.

All classes will be on the outdoor arena as single phase. The whole course is timed.

Senior & Junior mixed 60cm: first half: 60cm second half: 65cm

Horse/ pony eligibility – May not have completed a BS/BE 85cm or above or any discipline BRC championships at 90cm or above in the previous 12 months.

Horses may not have completed a BS 1m or BE 2* or above in the previous 2 years.

Senior 70cm: First half: 70cm second half: 75cm.

Horses / ponies eligibility: May not have completed a BS/ BE at 95cm or above or any discipline BRC championships 100cm or above in the previous 12 months.

Horses may not have completed a BS 1m 10cm or BE 3* or above in the previous 2 years.

Senior 80cm : First half 80cm second half: 85cm.

Horse / pony eligibility – May not have completed a BS/BE 105cm or above in the previous 12 months.

Horses may not have completed a BS 1m 20cm or BE 4* or above in the previous 2 years.

Senior & Junior mixed 90cm: First section: 90cms second half: 95cms.

Horse / pony eligibility: May not have completed a BS/ BE 115cm or above in the previous 12 months. .

Senior & Jun mixed 100cm: 1st half: 100cm 2nd half: 105cm. Riders & H/P No limits

Senior & Jun mixed 105cm: 1st half 105cm 2nd half 110cm. Riders & H/P - No limits

Extra rules: horses/ ponies may only compete twice in two consecutive class heights. Can compete in one team or as individual at each height.

60cm + 70cm / 70cm + 80cm / 80cm + 90cm / 90 + 100cm / 100cm + 105cm.

** The 60cm class is the first class after the BRC club jumping classes.

Important information about the summer show jumping competition.

Class and order of jumping times will be available about the Wednesday or Thursday before the competition date.

There are times to walk the courses before the start of each class.

Please make sure riders clear up any hay & horse droppings around their vehicles before leaving.

Don't leave horses tie up to trailers or lorries unattended.

Please bring your horse's passport with you – incase the organisers want to check it.

Format for all classes in this Area 6 qualifier jumping classes:

The jumping order will hopefully mean team riders jumping one after another, this help with team spirit & allows riders to watch each other on the day.

All class heights will be run under –SINGLE PHASE – this will be a longer track in the arena and timed throughout the whole course.

The jumping rounds will be in the large outdoor arena with warm up outdoors on surfaces.

BRC Area 6 rules for this show Jumping competition.

All the classes are open to teams of 4 senior to jump with the best three scores in each round to count. These classes are also open to individuals.

60cm class will be the first class after the BRC club Sj classes, then class heights will follow through.

Numbers should be printed by competitors and worn in number bibs please.

For show Jumping – whips.

One whip is permitted and must be between 45cm – 75cm and must not be weighted or feature a hard point at the end. The end if the whip must be padded.

Flu vaccination rules – Please refer to the BRC Area 6 Dressage and Show Jumping competition rules 2026 on www.obrc.org.uk **AREA 6**

It is compulsory for all horses to be microchipped.

** Flu vaccinations must not be done within 6 days of the competition date.

Please check your passports carefully and make sure that your horses / ponies vaccinations are kept up to date throughout the year.

Protective Headwear Rules.

BRC have updated their rules on riding / competition hats for 2024.

All riding / competition hats worn at Area qualifying competitions will need to be re-tagged with the new **PINK tag.**

Hats that meet one of the following standards.

British: PAS 015 2011 with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC mark

New standard BS EN 1384 (2023) when this comes on the market – will be accepted.

European: VG1 01.040: 2014-12 with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC mark

American: ASTM F1163: 2004a or 04a onwards with SEI mark. Also SNELL E2016 Australian & NZ: AS/NZS 3838: 2006 onwards with SAI global mark.

PAS 015: 1998 and SNELL E2001 will no longer be accepted.

** If you need to get a **PINK Tag** on your hat, this can be checked & tagged at the secretary's office before you compete on the competition day

Body Protectors

From January 1st 2024 the BETA 2009 Purple Label will no longer be accepted.

The exception to this requirement is that the EXO Body cages will continue to be accepted, provided they have a BETA Level 3 Purple 2000 Label.

If a rider chooses to wear an airbag style body protector for X-C or SJ it must be worn over a permitted BETA Level 3 body protector.

Hybrid Air Jackets & air jackets incorporated into blouson style jacket are permitted.

A body protector are strongly recommended in show jumping competitions.

A BETA Level 3 displaying a Blue 2018 Label must be worn in competitions where a body protector is obligatory. From **1st January 2024 Beta Level 3 (Purple label) body protector which has a 2009 label will no longer be accepted.**

Body protectors should be fitted and worn as per manufacturer's instructions. The up to date BETA list of body protectors can be obtained from www.beta-uk.org . If a rider chooses to wear an airbag style body protector it must be worn over a permitted BETA Level 3 (Blue label) body protector and if activated, must be deflated or removed before continuing.

Hybrid Air-jackets and blouson style air jackets are permitted. Recommended that body protectors are replaced once they are more than 5 years old
