Horses and ponies can only enter one class height.

Entry fees for Area 6 horse trials qualifiers.

OBRC will pay the BRC pre-entry per member to help with entry fees.

Entries can only be submitted by the team manager. * Main entry fee for the team of four & individuals – cost @ £89 per rider. (includes Vet & paramedic cover on the day) <u>Entries will open on 21st April</u>

Horse Trials entry fees MUST be paid to OBRC bank account by no later than <u>Monday 12th May</u> to secure class entries.

No pre- entries will be made until the main entry fee has been paid into the OBRC bank account.

HELPERS NEED.

OBRC members can only compete if the club provides one helper per team or 4 individuals. If you can spare a full day to volunteer your time. We would be grateful as it takes a lot of people to run these competitions. Please contact Anka Taylor.

Details of height classes, entry fees for teams & individuals.

Please carefully read all the eligibility rules for the classes.

BRC Senior HT 70 Qualifier. Open to teams & individuals.
Dressage test: BE 91 (2009) DRESSAGE
SJ fence heights: 70cm. XC:70 cm.
Eligibility: Horse may be registered with BE but <u>must not</u> have any BE points.
Max 10 foundation BE points.
Horses: Not to have completed a BE 90cm or above in 12 months beforethe preentry
Riders: May not compete BE 90cm or BRC HT 90cm or above in current competition year at close of prelim entry.
Riders: Can not compete in 90cm or above at same qualifier or Championship.

BRC Senior HT 80 Qualifier. Open to teams & individuals.

Dressage test: BE 92 (2009) DRESSAGE

SJ fence heights: 80cm. XC: 80 cm.

Eligibility for horses: May be registered with BE <u>but must not have any BE points</u>. Not have completed a BE 100 or above in the 12 months before pre-entry.

BRC Senior HT 90 Qualifier. Open to teams & individuals
Dressage test: BE 95 (2012) DRESSAGE
SJ fence height: 90cm. XC: 90cm. Speed for XC: 450mpm
Eligibility for horses: May be currently registered with BE, but not have completed a
BE105 or higher in the 12 months before pre-entry. BE 5 points max.

BRC Senior and Junior HT 100 qualifier. Open to teams and individuals. Dressage Test: **BE 101 (2009)** DRESSAGE SJ fence heights: 1m. XC: 1m. Speed XC: 475mpm. **Eligibility: No limits on horse or rider.**

Information about the Horse trials on Saturday 7th June.

The Area 6 horse trials qualifiers will be run in conjunction with the Munstead unaffiliated horse trials.

Class heights may not run in order – any time requests for riders may have to be added when making entries.

All horse's passports must be taken to the secretary's tent to be checked on arrival.

Horses must be entered under the name on their passport.

The dressage arenas, show jumping & XC country course will all be run on grass. XC does include ditch and a canter through water complex. Plus the usual xc fences ridden over a flat & undulating terrain.

Riders will need to wear number bibs for all 3 disciplines - provide their own numbers.

Opportunities to walk the SJ course at change of class height.

Check with stewards on dressage arenas if you can carry a dressage whip in the test. **For Horse trials competitions:** Only a Jockey Skull hat complying with standards in the current BRC Handbook may be worn in XC phase. <u>This must not have a peak</u>. **For show Jumping – whips.**

One whip is permitted and must be between 45cm - 75cm and must not be weighted or feature a hard point at the end. The end if the whip must be padded

Protective Headwear Rules.

BRC have updated their rules on riding / competition hats for 2024.

All riding / competition hats worn at Area qualifying competitions will need to be retagged with the new **<u>PINK tag</u>**.

Hats that meet one of the following standards.

British: PAS 015 2011 with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC mark

New standard BS EN 1384 (2023) when this comes on the market – will be accepted. **European:** VG1 01.040: 2014-12 with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC mark **American:** ASTM F1163: 2004a or 04a onwards with SEI mark. Also SNELL E2016 Australian & NZ: AS/NZS 3838: 2006 onwards with SAI global mark. From 1st January 23 the PAS 015: 1998 and SNELL E2001 are no longer baccepted.

** If you need to get a **PINK Tag** on your hat, this can be checked & tagged at the secretary's office before you compete on the competition day.

Rules on the Flu Vaccinations for 2024

Your horse must have up to date influenza vaccinations in line with rule G7.1: in the current 2024 BRC Handbook page 25.

In order to compete a horse <u>must be</u> vaccinated in accordance with the above BRC rules and MUST also have had a vaccination within 12 calendar months (but not in any of the 7 preceding days) of the competition and / or entry to competition stables.

Horses may compete providing that they have had the first two primary injections providing the second vaccination (but not in any of the 7 preceding days) of the competition and / or entry to competition stables.

In the event of failure to comply with any of the requirements of the Flu vaccination rules, the horse or pony will be disqualified and not permitted to take part in any competition to which these rules apply.

It is compulsory for all horses to be microchipped.

<u>Please check your passports carefully and make sure that your horses / ponies vaccinations are kept up to date throughout the year.</u>

Body protectors – new rules for 2024.

A body protector is obligatory in all cross country competitions.

From January 1st 2024 the BETA 2009 Purple Label will no longer be accepted. The exception to this requirement is that the EXO Body cages will continue to be accepted, provided they have a BETA Level 3 Purple 2000 Label.

If a rider chooses to wear an airbag style body protector for X-C or SJ it must be worn over a permitted BETA Level 3 body protector.

Hybrid Air –Jackets and air jackets incorporated into a blouson style jacket are permitted.
