Details of classes & eligibilities for teams & individuals.

Full eligibility rules as per the current BRC Handbook – Page 99.

Class 1: Senior & Junior mixed Teams 100cm Qualifier. Speed mpm: 375

Eligibility: Horse & Ponies maybe registered with BE, but not to have gained more than 20 BE points.

Class 2: Senior & Junior mixed individuals 100cm Q Same eligibility for Class 1.

Class 6: Senior Team 90cm Qualifier. Speed mpm: 360

Eligibility: Riders not to have competed 3* or above in previous 5 years.

Horses or ponies maybe currently registered with BE and can have up to 1 BE point. Not to have been placed in the first six in any BE 100 or completed a BE 105 or higher in the current year or previous calendar year.

Class 6a: Senior individuals 90cm qualifier. Same eligibility rules as in Class 6.

Class 9: Senior Teams 80cm qualifier. Speed mpm: 350

Eligibility: Riders not to have competed 3* or above in previous 5 years & not to have completed a BE100 or above in current competition year at close of prelim entries.

Horses & ponies maybe registered with BE but must not have any points. Not to have been placed in the first six in any BE 90 or completed a BE 100 or above in current or previous calendar year.

Class 9a: Senior individuals 80cm Qualifier. Same eligibility rules as in Class 9.

Class 11: Senior & Junior mixed teams 70cm qualifier. Speed mpm: 340

Eligibility: Riders not to have completed a BE90, AE90, BRC HT90 OR CH 90 in current competition year at close of prelim entries. Rider not to compete at 90cm or above in the same qualifier or Championship. Riders not to have competed 3* or above in previous 5 years

Horses and ponies maybe registered with BE but must not have any points. Not to have been placed in the first six in any BE 80 or completed a BE 90 or above in the current or previous calendar year.

Class 11a: Senior & Junior mixed individuals 70cm Q. Same rules as in class 11.

Wellington has a very large outdoor arena & a separate warm up arena.

The Arena Eventing competition is run over a course of 6 -9 show Jump fences, immediately followed by a course of 6 – 10 mixed solid XC fences. There a shallow canter through water which is just off the side of the arena & then out over the Jocker SJ fence & through the finish flags.

The whole course is judged on an optimum time, base on class height & speed mpm.

Important notice on entry fees for Area 6 qualifiers.

* BRC new rules insist that there is Vet in attendance for the whole day and this has put the entry fees up * Entering as an Individual @ £46 per member.

Team of three or four members @ £44 per member

(Entry fees include Paramedic and Vet on site all day).

Entry fees will need to be paid to OBHRC bank account by no later than Wednesday 8th September 2021 to secure your class entries.

Flu Vaccination Rules 2021.

*Due to COVID-19 new rules on handling passports to avoid contamination * .

There is a new system: For new horse's who have not competed in the Area 6 competitions since 2020. **Photo of page showing horse's name, passport number & vaccination flu dates needs to be emailed to the Team manager: Sally by no later than 31st August.** All horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months and 21 days of the competition date. Most recent flu booster date after 12th March 2021, but not within 7 days of the of 1st October 2021.

* Please can you send Sally your most recent vaccination date for our records.

Riders must bring their own Number bibs – You will be required to print your own paper numbers out too.

Medical Armbands

Medical arm are strongly recommended for any type of cross- country competition.

These must be worn on the arm and not on the leg. They should be filled in with all the relevant competitor's details. Spot checks will be carried out in the collecting ring.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THESE RULES ARE A GUIDELINE SO PLEASE CHECK THE BRC OFFICIAL HANDBOOK TO ENSURE THAT YOU ARE WITHIN THE RULES.

Protective Headwear Rules.

Correct riding attire must be worn at all times. When mounted at any BRC event whether competing or not ' Protective Headwear ' must be worn & fastened under the chin is mandatory .

All hat must have the aqua hat tag visible with either BRC, PC or BE logos. Failure to do so will incur elimination.

All protective headwear can be checked at the Area 6 competitions and tagged before competing if you have not got the aqua tag.

For Arena Eventing competition: Only a Jockey Skull hat complying with standards in the current BRC Handbook may be worn. This must not have a peak, any peak type extensions or noticeable protuberances above the eyes or in front, should have an even round or elliptical shape with smooth or slightly abrasive surface removable hat cover with a light flexible peak may be used.

Body Protectors

A Beta Level 3 (Purple label) body protector which has a 2009 label or later must be worn. Body protectors should be fitted and worn as per manufacturer's instructions. The up to date BETA list of body protectors can be obtained from www.beta-uk.org . If a rider chooses to wear an airbag style body protector it must be worn over a permitted BETA Level 3 (Purple label) body protector and if activated, must be deflated or removed before continuing.

Hybrid Air-jackets and blouson style air jackets are permitted. Recommended that body protectors are replaced once they are more than 5 years old.

Riders wearing Exo Body Cage protectors must inform the secretary at all events.
