### **2021 New BRC Area Show Jumping rules:**

Riders can enter more than one class as a team member or individual:

70cm & 80cm. / 80cm & 90cm./ 90cm & 100cm.

The 70cm class will be first class of the day & the heights go upwards.

There is also Open 80cm individual qualifier - Class 7 with no restrictions.

Please note the London & South East team qualifier has separate rules.

Up to 6 teams can qualify for L&SE Championships on 10<sup>th</sup> October at Pulborough.

Closing date for all entries is on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> June.

**Payments for entries need to be made by the closing date or before please.**

### Details of heights, classes, eligibility for riders & horses / ponies.

**The qualifiers consist of both teams & individuals for all height levels.**

( all team members in each class are automatically entered as individuals as well )

#### **Class 1A: NAF Superflex Senior 70 Show Jumping Teams & individuals**

**Senior 70cm:** First round 70cm & second round 75cm with timed course.

Horses / ponies eligibility – not to have no BE or foundation points & no BS points  
gained at 90cms or higher.

Horses not been placed in top 6 BE90 or competed BE100 in current or previous year.

#### **Class 2A: NAF Superflex Senior 80 Show Jumping Teams & individuals**

**Senior 80cm:** First round 80cm & second round 85cm with timed course.

Horses / ponies eligibility not to have won 75 BS notional points and only 1 BE point.

Must not have been placed in the top six in BE100cm or competed in BE 105 or above  
in current or previous calendar year.

#### **Class 3A: NAF Superflex Senior 90 Show Jumping Teams & individuals**

**Senior 90cm:** First round 90cms and second round 95cms with timed course.

Horses / ponies eligibility: No more than 500 BS notional pts. No more than 20 BE  
Pts.

#### **Class 4A: NAF Superflex mixed 100cm Show Jumping Teams & individuals**

First round 100cm and second round 1.05cm.

Horses eligibility not won more than 999 BS notional points. Max of 60 BE points.

#### **Class 5A: NAF Superflex mixed 110cm Show Jumping Teams & individuals**

First round 110cm & 2nd round 115cm. Horses ignitibility unlimited BS and BE  
points.

#### **Class 7C: NAF Superflex Senior Open 80cm Show jumping individuals only.**

#### **[Class 9: London & South East 80cm Show Jumping team qualifier.](#)**

**Eligibility rules:** Horses & ponies must be 4 years & over.

Riders not gained Pony Club A test or BHS Stage 4 Senior Coach during last 10 years.

Riders must not have gained FBHS or BHS Stage 5 Performance Coach.

Horse/rider combination must not have won an official BS class where the height of  
first round is 1.00m or above in the last 3 years.

Horse / pony not to have gained more than 700 BS points.

Horse / pony must not have qualified for the BRC 100 SJ or 110 SJ Winter or Summer  
National RC Championships or PC intermediate or Open Championships last 3 years.

## **Senior Style Jumping Classes**

**Class 10 A:** Natural Animal Feeds Senior Style Jumping Teams

4 riders to ride 2 x 75cm Style & 2 x 85cm Style rounds.

(all team members are automatically entered as individuals )

**Class 10 B:** Natural Animal Feeds 75 Senior Style Jumping individuals

**Class 10 C:** Natural Animal Feeds 85 Senior Style Jumping individuals

### **Style Jumping explained.**

Riders enter the arena, salute to the judge, then canter a figure of eight until the signal to start is given: during this time riders will be judged on for style on the flat.

For the jumping section: riders will be judged on how they ride the whole course, particular attention being given to the turns, presenting the horse at the a fence.

Take off, in the air & landing positions over the fences, correct speed towards & away from fences.

### **Information & rules - Show Jumping Qualifier on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> July.**

#### **BCA Facilities.**

BCA has an outdoor arena for warming up in & top arena is the jumping arena which approx 25 - 30m wide x 60m long this is where the first round of jumping is done.

The second round is in the indoor arena which is approx 60m long x 30- 35 m wide.

#### **Format for all Area qualifier Jumping classes:**

Team members will jump one after another and both teams and individuals will jump two rounds unless riders are eliminated or gain 24 faults in the first round.

Riders will jump the first round and then a short break before second round.

The second round will be run as a single phase competition, which will be timed.

There are course walks times at beginning of the class & in the middle.

#### **Please note carefully the height rises for the second round of Jumping Courses**

Fences in the second round will be set about 5cms more than the first round height.

**Please think carefully when choosing which class / course height you want to enter.** \*\* Remember as the course get bigger and it is tighter to ride in the indoor arena.

#### **Competitor's numbers**

Competitors need to supply their own number, this can be bib, bridle or saddle pad numbers.

### **Rules on the Flu Vaccinations & microchips for 2021**

All horses Flu vaccinations will need to return to the 6 months & 21 days ruling as of 1st October 2020.

No flu injection should be done any later than 7 days before the competition date.

Please can you check that your horse's flu vaccinations are up to date before entering.

Since COVID-19 there are changes in the Area 6 Q competitions & how they are organised.

All passports are checked well before the day of the competition by the Diane Hunt.

You will be asked to send a photo of your horse's passport with horse's name, passport number & microchip number.

Photos of the dates of vaccinations from the start of 1st, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> dates up to the current & recent vaccination this year.

These will be recorded on an excel sheet for future reference and help to speed up checking for any Area qualifiers entered going forward.

Please check your passports carefully and make sure that your horses / ponies fully vaccinations are kept up to date throughout the year.

Passports must travel with horses and there may be spot checks on the day

#### **Protective Headwear Rules.**

Correct riding attire must be worn at all times. When mounted at any BRC event whether competing or not Protective Headwear must be worn & fastened under the chin is mandatory .

All hat must have the aqua hat tag visible with either BRC, PC or BE logos. Failure to do so will incur elimination.

All protective headwear can be checked at the Area 6 competitions and tagged before competing if you have not got the aqua tag.
