BRC Club Jumping Series 2026

Reports on Recent BRC Area 6 Competition Qualifiers

Grassroots and the Open dressage at Wellington Riding on 19th October Congratulations to all eleven members who competed at the Area 6 dressage qualifiers on Sunday 19th October at Wellington Riding. Unfortunately we could only make up the **grassroots team** with three members, but despite that the team finished in 3rd place with individual places: Louise Bennett (6th), Ellie Rose (3rd) and Julie Fleming (1st). We fielded to two open teams one with 4 members and one with 3 members.

Gold team members all rode well finishing in 5th place: Alexa Iona-Smith (4th), Janine Modder (10th) & Kirsty Scott (1st).

The blue team finished in 1st place with individual placing: Carol Fletcher (2nd), Jane Bancroft (1st), Tamsin Morris (2nd) Alison Dippenaar stepped up a level to novice & rode a good test just finished out of the placing. Julie Fleming competed in the BRC prelim test as an individual & won with 75%. PYO medium class Tamsin Morris finished in 4th place and Jillie Luff rode in 5th place. Teresa Carnt and Elaine Browne kindly offered to be club volunteers on the day.

Reports on Recent BRC Championships

BRC National Horse Trials Championships was at Swalcliffe Equestrian, near Banbury on Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd August. Elizabeth Etchells and Maurice competed in the 70cm competition and did very well, considering this was their first serious horse trials.

Saturday was the dressage and show jumping phases and they produced a very good dressage score at 27.7 & clear SJ. Sunday was XC day with competitors needing stamina to ride over the very undulating & hilly course and some challenging fences. Maurice jumped well, with just one stop on a skinny fence and finished with some time faults.



Summer Championships at Lincoln Saturday 30th August

Tamsin Morris competed and represented OBRC on Saturday in the dressage championship classes. The atmosphere is the warm up arenas was electric with excited horses, but despite this Tamsin & Khadira rode a good elementary test to finish in 6th place. After a short break they finished 8th in medium test.



Show Jumping Championships at Lincoln Sunday 31st August

What a wonderful trip everyone had at the NAF national show jumping championships at Lincoln Showground on Sunday 31st August. Despite the long drive up the A1 and a stay overnight camping and horses staying in the stables.

Louise Pusey started the day off by jumping a double clear early in the morning over the two 60 – 65cm courses and finished 18th out 88 other riders!

The 70cm team jumping came next with Gina Elliott, Ellie Rose, Hannah Brookfield & Louise Pusey all jumping two rounds in two very different arenas. Stephanie Brookfield was on hand to help everyone and support. Everyone coped with atmosphere and jumped well and the OBRC team finished in 9th place which was fantastic.







Club Show Jumping Championships

BRC started a new Jumping competition with qualifiers this year to encourage those members not ready to compete in the Area SJ qualifiers. By offering courses starting at 40cm, moving up to 50cm & 60cm with very simple courses. To qualify riders needed to jump two clear rounds at two separate competitions. The championships was held at local venue Bury Farm, Slapton on Saturday 6th September. We had three members who qualified and all did very well at the championships. Anne Jermey & Lilly won the 40cm, with Paula Wynn & Puzzle coming 2nd.

Carina Vials & Ted finished in 3rd place in the 50cm, with Paula Wynn in 7th position. 60cm class Carina jumped a fast clear to finish in 2nd place.



Combined Training Championships at Aston Le Walls

Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th September Our open team competing on Saturday with Gina Elliott & Buddy, Leah Upton & Fred, Stephanie Brookfield & Little Madame, Rebecca Taylor & Archie. Although they did their best in the dressage tests and jumped well, unfortunately the team finished outside the placing. Fab Fred jumped one of the only nine clears over the show jumping course and Gina stepped up a level to compete in the novice test and jump an 80cm SJ course.

Alexa Iona-Smith rode as an individual and produced an excellent dressage and clear round show jumping to win her championship class which was fantastic.

The novice team competed on Sunday with Elaine Browne & Jay, Ellie Rose & Prea, Louise Pusey & Billy, Elizabeth Etchells & Maurice. Again they all rode & jumped brilliantly and the team finished in 12th place out of 27 other teams. Louise Pusey came 4th in her arena.

Kirsty Scott and Charlie competed as an individual in novice test & 80cm CT class finishing in 3rd place.
