Nov 9-19, 1978 Terrific time at the hut! We have found everything in order + have enjoyed our stay very much. Our first two days the beach was quite different - there was a storm (paper said typhoon) out at sea - after it bypassed Karachi we heard about it (Shakar ho). The waves were big (6-7 feet) + the high tide at night came right up to the hut foundation (free face wash for the lazy) But scary old bean! Riding the waves was terrific! It really threw us around. The high tide also brought in a lot of shells we had not seen previously. We got "LOB-A-STUR" local word for lobster at the far village up the beach going west (you can tell that by the way the sun goes down) - still only Rs 20/- for the big ones - MIGHTY FINE EATING! While we were here two bananas - 4 tomatoes - two rolls of homemade sausage went rotten - We saw several big m.a.m.a turtles waddling up the beach and lay eggs - we also saw the offspring come out of the sand and totter down to the shore - we even saved about 15 from the crows - (by the way if you hear a racket from the crows - go + investigate it may be baby turtles) We followed one out about 100 feet into the ocean then (at only a few hours old) he out swam us + we lost him - the impudence of youth! Had a scare one night - I was awakened by a noise + looked out the window to see a dude coming up the beach in the moonlight with a rifle over his shoulder - "Gabriel here I come" He went by + I began breathing again - THEN - two more blokes came by - they had a conference + ~~decided~~ decided to investigate my motorcycle up on the porch - "Gabriel I'm on my way" all three had rifles - M.x.mants I was sure - Dacoits beyond doubt - So up I gets + threw the screen (for protection I stayed inside the screen) I ask - "KYA CHAHEA"

It's been great vacation for Jimmy and some 5-7 turtles. How up today for some great body surfing. (Jim must be Karen) Karen + I and out we had become Auntie & Uncle for the 1st time as my brother and his wife had a boy Dec-8th.

Another B. note: we saw a school of 30 dolphins swimming by: they say that whenever you find dolphins you don't find sharks (dolphins can kill sharks).

We walked down and spent New Year's eve with the Keith Mitchell and Ingeess at the CMS hut (about an hour walk) (at night).

I hope it was O.K. to put up the 2 drawings of the hut - it is string stretches and they hang unevenly just twist it or wrap it up to some more.

We'll be down at Montgomery's hut (20 or so east of here) until the end of Jan. helping out with beach camps (it sounds great to us too).

Suggestion: If you see any little turtles hatching put them in a bucket and carry them out to the water - it should save some.

I found you can ride these turtles as they swim out - hold the sides of the shell just behind the front flippers.

Later: I theorize that the holes in the small rocks are mostly caused by a species of shellfish  that (I presume) has chemical excretions that dissolve rock. The holes are usually long like the shells, most all rocks with holes are not conglomerates so no way a small pebble could start a hole; also how could shells be found in large holes ~~if~~ if the holes were there 1st. They couldn't start as small ones and move up.

Jan 1, 1980 - Jan 8

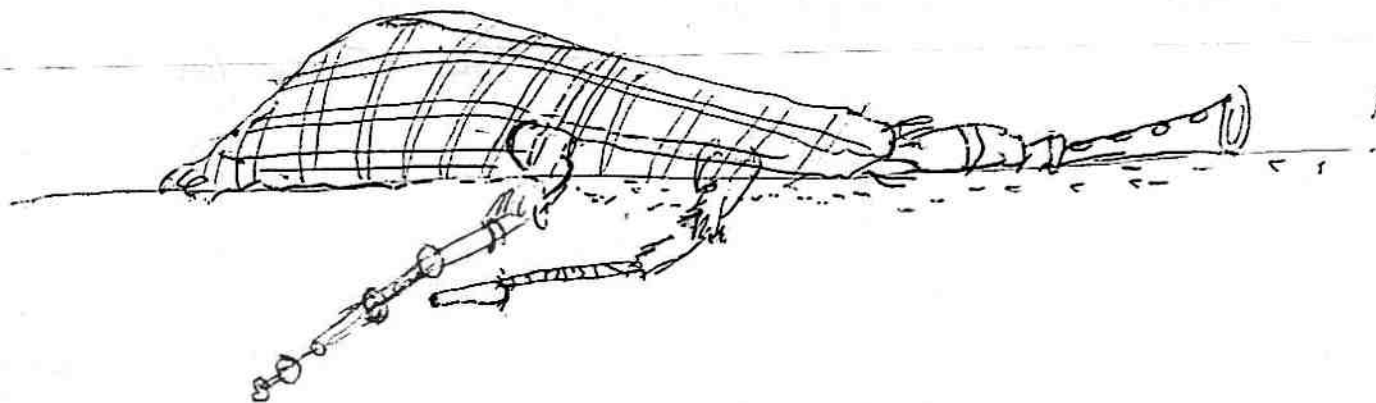
No baby turtles - 2 adult turtles sighted. The weather was beautiful most of the time.

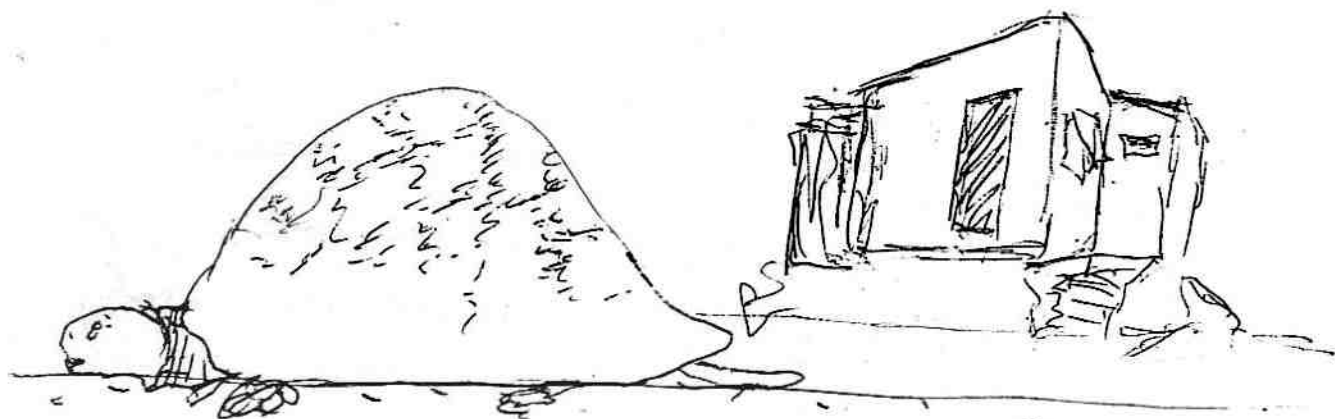

The problem of the picking of the eyes might be solved by placing a 2nd circle of gauze outside the present one.
