It was very cold here for a few days. We had a big job reviving ~~the~~ cold, unconscious baby turtles in warm sea water. In all, we released about 500 into the sea. We also saw three mothers laying one morning and lots of DEAD baby turtles. The water was too cold for more than a couple of short swims.

Jenny - When we got the turtles, they were so frozen it took forever to revive them. Still, a lot died. We had to change the water throughout the day to keep it warm, and we used up every plastic container in the house to keep them in. Even so, we had to take down approx. 30 turtles to the Murrays [Team Jay] coz we ran out of room. We divided the baby turtles into groups of - nearly dead, deadies; reviving; living; & very lively. That way we kept track of which ones needed attention, and made sure the lively swimmers had a good container to swim in.

It was a lot of fun looking after all the turtles, but also hard work. When the Murrays visited us, they couldn't believe it! - turtles everywhere!! 😊

Ben - One thing I did enjoy was all the turtles. We saw about four mother turtles on the first morning.

On New Year's Eve we stayed up quite late playing games, and

eating. Then we went to bed.

In the middle of the night a weird old man came along to our house and opened a window shutter.

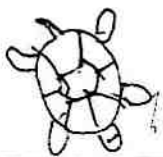
Jan 1st to 8th 1991 Peter, Anna Crawford - Judith, Sharon + Colin

On Saturday night we had a bonfire with the Kerbys, the Murrels, The Stases, and the Jones.

On Sunday morning the same people came to our Sunday Service. I've liked this week at the beach.

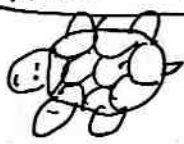
Another day saw a snake quite close to our hut.

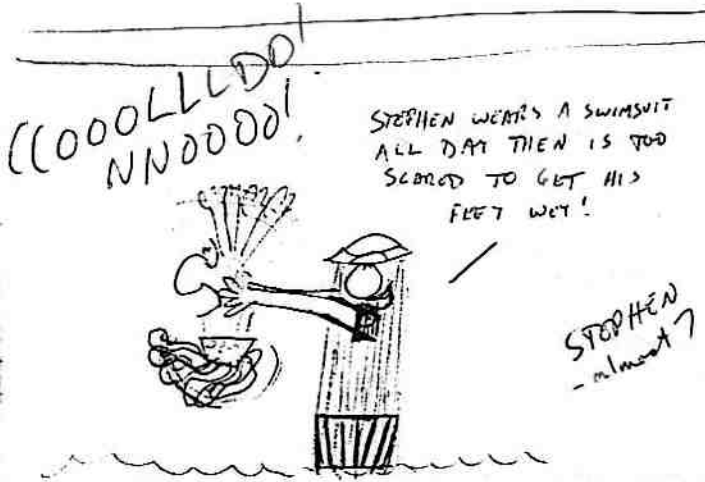

Sunday we went with Vardys to a beach beyond Paradise Point. It is really beautiful - rugged and backed by cliffs. The tide

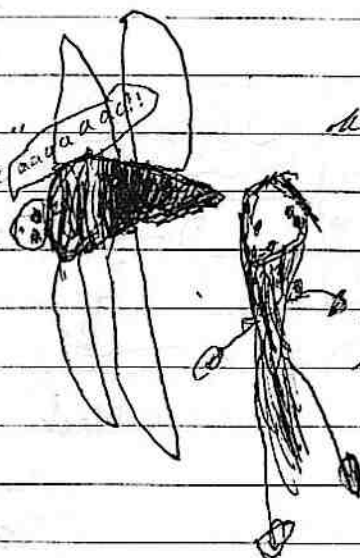
