

Tip: After the salting step, run the cucumbers through your salad spinner to spin off any remaining moisture and salt before proceeding with the recipe.

Cook's Notes: Substitute mayonnaise, Greek yogurt or buttermilk (use half) for the sour cream if you prefer. Don't expect to mix this up and then consume it immediately, or you will have a bland, tasteless salad. It really needs time to mellow and allow the flavors to soak in, and that means letting it sit overnight in the fridge, or at very least, two to three hours. If you omit the salting step, taste and add salt as needed.

Cucumber and Onion Vinegar Salad: Increase the vinegar and sugar to 2/3 cup each and omit the sour cream. I like to use celery seed instead of dill in this version.

Aunt Mary's Pecan Pralines

- ♦ 2 CUPS SUGAR
- ♦ 1 CUP BROWN SUGAR
- ◆ 1 CUP EVAPORATIID MILK
- ♦ 2 CUPS CHOPP£D PECANS
- ♦ 2 TBSP BUTTER
- ♦ 1 TEASPOON VANILLA
- ♦ 1 1/8TH TEASPOON SALT



Combine sugars and evaporated milk in a four-quart microwave safe measuring cup. Microwave on high for six minutes. Stir well. Add nuts, butter, vanilla and salt.

Microwave on high six more minutes. Stir until thickened. Working rapidly, drop by teaspoonfuls onto wax paper. Let cool. Makes 3 dozen.

Sour Cream Cucumber and Onion Salad

Prep time: 10 min-Inactive time: 2 hours

Yield: About 4 to 6 servings

Ingredients

4 large cucumbers

1 tablespoon kosher salt

1 extra-large Vidalia onion

For the Dressing:

1/3 cup white vinegar

1/3 cup granulated sugar

1 cup sour cream

1/4 teaspoon freshly cracked black pepper, or to taste 2 teaspoons fresh chopped dill (or 1/4 teaspoon dried dill weed), optional

Instructions

Peel cucumbers and slice about 1/2 inch thick. Add to a colander placed on a rimmed dish, toss with salt and let rest for at least 30 minutes to draw out some of the water.

For the dressing, whisk together the vinegar, sugar, sour cream, pepper, and dill weed, if using. Halve and slice the onions into thick slices, adding to the dressing with the cucumbers. Toss, cover tightly, and store in refrigerator for several hours, or preferably overnight, before serving, until well chilled, stirring occasionally.





BOARD BRIEFS

\$ MESQUITE CLUB FINANCIAL STATEMENT \$



The May board meeting was called to order at 10:09 a.m., President Bolling led the Pledge of Allegiance the Collect.

FIRST VICE PRESIDENT: Annette Dorman reported this club's year has been

positive for meeting attendance averaging 28 and positive for participation in regular hostess duties. We had speakers or presenters at most of our regular meeting. We have had three High Teas this year, with the rest of the dates taken by Ways and Means, Community Service and Special Tea functions. The Garden Tea, Silver Tea and Holiday luncheon averaged 50 in attendance.

SECOND VICE PRESIDENT: Corrine Mewhirter reported we have engaged seven new members this year for a total of 101 members.

WAYS AND MEANS: Elsa Torgeson stated the "Going, Going, Gone" lunch on March 15 was presented by a 12 member committee who donated 150 hours to this event plus actions items. Six Leprechauns served an Irish lunch. \$3,185.96 was raised. Wall of Remembrance chair has to order bricks. We hope to clear \$2,500. Rummage sale raised \$5,355.18. She is proud the committee, with the inclusion of fall events brought in \$12,000 and their budget as \$10,500.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: Sue Churchill is very proud of the job her committee did to raise funds for Veteran's Village. A big check for \$6,000 was presented at the closing luncheon. The year-long collection boxes of needed items taken to their facility totaled \$2,072. Total donations totaled \$8,195.

EVENING MESQUITE REPRESENTATIVE: On April 2 the Evening Mesquite approved their slate of officers for 2019-2020. The ladies proceeded to put together 100 hygiene bags for Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth. April 23rd the three scholarship recipients were honored and given \$25 Amazon gift cards and roses.

NEW BUSINESS

A letter of Resignation was read from Johanna Kennedy. Resignation was accepted. This left the Ways and Means Chairman and Celebration of Life Tile Wall positions vacant. A motion was made by Cathi Poer that the incoming Nominating Committee to fill this vacancy. Motion passed. President Bolling stated Linda Baxter will now head the Tile Wall position.

Tile Wall project has sold 27 tiles. Linda Baxter announced she found a local engraver and File vendor. Tiles are \$100.

Linda Baxter presented correspondence from Kelly Mizrachi from Life & Legacy, a Jewish Organization who would like to participate with Mesquite Club. There mission is to create Financial Stability for Nevada Jewish agencies.

Meeting adjourned at 11: 25 a.m.
