Beautification Committee Update!

FLOOR - On June 10, as planned, we started the floor repairs. I personally saw the cement after the carpet was removed, I knew it was going to be a challenge to repair. Over the next two weeks and several meetings with the contractor, we walked onto a new smooth concrete floor! A huge improvement! The minor issue in the kitchen was also repaired. We look forward to the new carpet being installed by mid-August.

ELECTRICAL - After the floor was completed, I contacted the electrician, whose bid we had accepted in late May, and they had agreed to work for us. Without notice, they decided not to work for us. We have started the process of interviewing new electricians. After many meetings and bids, we have hired an electrician who will be starting the week of July 29. The decision has been made to exchange the fluorescent tubes in the current fixtures with LED tubes. This upgrade will be more cost effective. Cheryl Musser is continuing to work on the Grant with NV Energy. New chandeliers and ceiling fans have arrived and are waiting patiently for installation.

PAINT and CARPET- Will follow as soon as the electrical work is complete.

AWNING - Our new awning, graciously donated by Mickey Pajor, has been installed. It is a lovely addition to the building! We are excited for the membership to see it.



Happy Summer ladies,


I hope you are staying cool this summer. If you are, that means you are most likely NOT in Las Vegas.
