



What's the board up to!

April 2, 2024

Call to order: President, Frankie Chase-Segel, called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. with the secretary present.

President's Report: President Chase-Segel expressed the Board's sympathy at the passing of Clyde DeWitt, Cherie Williams-DeWitt's husband. She then reported that the Ways & Means Event, Sipping Into the Sixties, was a success and an enjoyable time was had by all. President Chase-Segel then reported that the nomination slate for the 2024-2025 Club Year was announced and reminded everyone the nominations were still open until the vote at the April 12, 2024 Business Meeting.

Second Vice President: Mickey Pajor reported that we have 3 new members: Shelley Berkley, Betty Atencio, and Alice Curtis. Bringing new member total to 15 for 2023-2024 Club Year.

Treasurer's Report: Corinne Mewhirter distributed the Profit & Loss Statement and Balance Sheet for March 2024 showing a healthy balance in the Club's bank accounts of \$146,003.62. Treasurer Mewhirter went on to say that the Rummage Sales raised \$12490.73, before expenses. The Evening Ways & Means event raised \$4,010.50, exceeding our budgeted amount. Daytime Ways and Means has raised \$31,188.34 exceeding our budgeted amount by \$16,188.34. Membership increased by \$4,200 and Club expenses were \$55,586.65 less than the budgeted amount.

Financial Secretary: Nancy Zangl distributed the March 2024 Financial report which shows a total income of \$18,297.85, which included \$1,658.36 raised at the Ways & Means Wine Tasting event. Secretary Zangl went on to report that rather than the normal three invoices from NV Energy we only received two. After calling NV Energy she found out that we had a \$600 credit. Secretary Zangl reported that she received a note from Sigrid Insull-Lucking announcing her intent to transfer from Evening to Daytime Group, as required by the By Laws.

Corresponding Secretary: Sylvia Phillips reported that she had sent a thank you note to Frankie Segel-Chase for her recent donation.

Building Chair: Chairman Cherie Williams-DeWitt was excused early. President Chase-Segel reported that the Club had received several rental opportunities for the month of April. Director Cathi Poer expressed her concerns about homeless people sleeping on the property. Custodian, John King, reported to her that the sensor box for the lights in the trash area has been covered several times. It is thought that the person who did it thought it was a camera because of the blinking red light. We will keep an eye on it and if it becomes more of an issue, it will be reported to the authorities.

Community Services: Chairman Chris White reported that everyone on her Committee plus several "Angels" were working hard to make the Elegant Tea on April 6th a success. Currently, we have about 50 reservations but hope to get several more before Saturday. The Committee will be setting up on Thursday morning and Friday, if needed. There will be entertainment, raffles, and a silent auction. They are still looking for donations of gift cards to use on the tree as well as for the baskets in the auction.

Evening Representative: Evening Representative, Dolores Martinez, reported that on Sunday, March 10th, several Mesquite Club members, both day and evening, attended the Variety Children's Charity Oscar Event at the Brendan Theaters at the Palms. All had a fun time. The Evening Members were recently invited for a tour of the Community Counseling Center, the current 2023 HCA benefit recipient. The tour included a visit to the Adolescent Art Therapy room that was made possible by the Club's donation. On March 26, 2024, Community Services chairs, Pat Garcia, and Pamela Ivey, completed their last project of the year; a supply drive for pets to benefit the Nevada SPCA. We were able to donate \$310 of pet supplies. The Evening Mesquite Club completed their slate of Elected Chairs for the 2024-2025 Club Year and will present it at the April 9th meeting with election being held on April 23, 2024. Representative Martinez reminded everyone of their last Ways and Means event, Derby Day, being held on May 7, 2024.

Ways & Means Committee: Chairman Linda Zesiger everyone for their help with the Ways & Means fundraiser, "Sipping' Into the Sixties" on March 22nd, as well as those people that donated to over \$50,000 raised this year.

Community Services Director: Director Cathi Poer reminded everyone that not only does Community Service raise money for our charities but also help many people with our "in kind" donations for food, supplies, and time to support our local Community.

New Business:

Preservation Foundation Tour: President Chase-Segel reminded everyone of that we will be a stop on the Las Vegas Preservation Foundation's Home + History Las Vegas tour on Sunday, April 28th. We will be providing champagne and light refreshments and will need members to staff the Club from 11:00 am to 6:00 pm and passed a sign-up sheet for volunteers. President Chase-Segel had spoken to Evening Member, Connie Freeman, about having a prototype of the planned "In-Kind" Donations Area set up prior to the Tour. It was suggested that we show the Fashion Show movie featuring fashion over the years on the TV. There will be a planning meeting will be held, date and time to be determined, soon to go over the details.

Beautification Committee Update: Committee co-chair, Carol Seibel, updated the Board on the status of the plans to remodel the Clubhouse. The Committee was able to engage the services of a General Contractor to oversee the work at no charge to the Club. He will be donating his time and commission to the Club and will be responsible for contracting reputable subcontractors. The estimate for the floor repair and carpet came in at \$29,000 total. Co-chair, Cheryl Musser reported that she is working with NV Energy to get a grant for all or some of the expenses of new lighting. The Committee will be presenting their recommendations to the Board and Building Committee for approval soon and hope to start demolition of the floor at the beginning of June.

Notes from your editor.


What a year this has been. There have been up's and down's, but we have survived.
