

#### WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Words cannot express my gratitude for the support given me during the past several years by Mesquite Club members (both daytime and evening) and the Junior Mesquite Club for the Women's Development Center. Our clothing and household goods drives were most successful; the Christmas gifts and Easter baskets prepared by the Evening Mesquite were outstanding and helped make the holiday more pleasant for both the women and children; the cookies donated (or I scrounged) from the bridge chairmen, tea committees, board meetings, memorials, etc. were highlights at the children's reading and craft classes. The trunk of my car is never empty. It's usually filled with clothing, household items, toys, cosmetics, etc. that is brought to our regular Friday meetings. And the "piece de resistance" was the bonus stamps collected from Vons to purchase dinnerware. A few members also included the \$1.00 along with their stamps for place settings and one Mesquite Club lady actually picked up the dishes. Although we paid only 99 cents for each place setting (approximately \$56.), the actual retail value of the dishes indicated on the Von's sales sli \$424. We were able to provide place settings for four for 14 families. The stamps represented food purchases of \$5,600. (Weight Watchers is listed in the telephone directory if anyone has need for it.)

### SUPPORT OF ACR 13 (Bill of Rights for Children)

ACR 13 has passed in the Nevada State Assembly and will shortly be brought before the State Senate. Blanche Zucker Bozarth was chairman of the coalition that first introduced the Bill of Rights (a General Federation of Women's Clubs project) to the Nevada State Legislature. She left for Carson City on Monday and expects to be called to testify before the Senate. She asked that we call one of the following State Legislature numbers. Leave a message that you are a member of the Nevada General Fedration of Women's Clubs and ask that a message be relayed to each of the members of the Department of Human Resources committee asking them to vote for the Bill when it reaches the Senate. Blanche feels that it is important that we express our support of the Bill and gain the support of the committee before the Bill is presented and to give her our support when she is called to testify.
