WANTA MAKE YOUR MESQUITER EDITOR HAPPY???

OATMEAL COOKIES

3 sticks butter (3/4 lb.)

2-1/2 cups light brown sugar

2 eggs

2/3 cup whole milk

3 teaspoons vanilla

6 cups Quick (small) Oats

2 cups flour

1 teaspoon of soda, salt and cinnamon

4 cups chopped walnuts

In a large mixing bowl, place the following: Softened butter; beat in sugar, eggs, milk and vanilla until a very smooth paste. (electric mixer)

In another bowl mix the dry ingredients, including the nuts, until all appear coated in flour, then slowly add the dry mixture to the smooth paste and continue mixing by hand until all the ingredients are well mixed.

Drop tablespoon size (golf ball) cookies on sheets until mix is exhausted - (80 cookies). Set oven at 375 degrees. While oven heats, take time to form each cookie until they resemble round balls one inch high. Cook each sheet exactly 10 minutes and remove sheet to cool for 2 or 3 minutes. Remove cookies to foil on counter to cool 10 or 12 minutes more, then place 20 cookies in a plastic bag and seal. Note: I think the reason they stay so fresh is because all the dry mix is coated in flour and holds the moisture. Also, they are not allowed to dry, just cool (15 minutes) before bagging.
