

## FINE ARTS MUSEUM

#### **NOW OPEN**

When Artist Lucile Bruner moved to Las Vegas half a century ago from culture-rich Santa Fe, she was shocked at the lack of interest in art and decided to do something about it. She had joined the Mesquite Club in 1950, so she organized a group of members to learn how to paint. That was the beginning of the Las Vegas Art League, which became the Las Vegas Art Museum in 1974. Over the years the volunteers hoped for a proper building "some day". That day came with the building of the Sahara West Library and the Fine Arts Museum at 9600 West Sahara Avenue, when the Library Board accepted the detailed prospectus submitted by the Las Vegas Art Museum Board.

At last there is a professional curator, James Mann, to lead the eager volunteers. Now the main gallery is an exhibit of contemporary works called "Art After Post-Modernism." Another gallery shows the Wilson Collection of vintage art. The Desert Sculptors have a gallery display and another room shows the works of two "Outside Artists." There is a gift shop.

At the Grand Opening, February 1, Mesquite Club members Lucile Bruner and Vivian Woods were honored.

Now is the time for the people of Southern Nevada to support the visual arts as they have the performing arts.


