On Friday May 3, at 1:30 pm, the staff and students of Doris French Elementary hosted a tea for the Ladies of Mesquite. Kevin Janison was there and documented the event with video that aired on his weather segment that evening. Principal Tammy Villarreal-Cobb gave a heartfelt thanks for our \$20,000 donation. The money will benefit the students in the following manner:

- \$10,000 will be spent on 50 Kindle Fires at \$159 each (\$8,000) and used to purchase novels and educational apps for the Kindles (\$2,000).
- \$1,000 will be spent on teacher wish-list items that include the following school-wide items: Time for Kids weekly reading materials, Story Works biweekly writing materials.
- \$1,600 will be spent on two new laptops for their computer lab.
- \$3,000 will be spent for field trip expenses. (buses and scholarships)
- \$3,000 will be spent on Study Island (school-wide computer programs that assist students in grades 1 thru 5).
- \$1,400 will be used for first and second grade math materials.

The students served us tea and the teachers made us sandwiches and deserts. It was a wonderful afternoon. They also serenaded us with a few tunes from their choir. They greatly appreciate our support. This is what community service is all about.

In 1911, one of the founders of Mesquite Club, Mrs. Givens, stated "A Woman's Club permits action in civic affairs, as well as art, literature, economics, domestic science and kindred subjects. In fact, such an organization is not limited in its work, nor in its purpose in advancing women. It admits the broadest lines of thought and work for progressive women."

Those progressive women were known as Mrs. James Givens, Mrs. A.J. Enking, Mrs. F.M. Grace, they had no first names like Joan and Sue and Phyllis. They were only known through their husbands, but as we all know, "behind every great man is an incredible woman."

Those women were <u>excited</u>, they had a vision for this dry, dusty, hot, wide spot in the desert they had come to call home. They could envision public transportation, parks, hospitals, libraries, a city of stature. And they did it.

The WORLD comes to our doorstep.

They were no different than the dynamic women right here in this room. I continue to be amazed that I know women whose names are on street signs and on buildings. Bernice helped to build the music department at the University, Paula's family name is on the entrance to a very large building, they've made hundreds of miles of roads Vegas drives on, Maureen served with our troops in the Middle East, Nadene was a Hospital Administrator, Pat was a school administrator, Diane is a judge, Blanche helped to shape legislation. This is who we are.

On Saturday of this year's Rummage Sale I was sitting at the table at the entrance to the kitchen when a man in his 40's stopped to visit a moment. He said, "Mesquite Club, isn't that the old ladies Club?" I said "yes, and I'm one of those old ladies". He got embarrassed and started backpedaling quickly, "Oh, I didn't mean it that way, I just meant you've been here a long time." I knew what he meant but it got me to thinking.

We may be 102 years old but we still matter, we still make a difference in our community. Mesquite Club is <u>never</u> going to be relegated to sit in a corner and brought out each year to ride in an antique parade and shown off as part of the city's heritage. We will <u>always</u> keep up to date on what is going on in our city. We will <u>always</u> search to find ways we can help our community and our neighbors. We will <u>always</u> be abreast of the political arena and we will <u>always</u> champion the rights and advancement of women and children.

We love our city. We will never stop looking for ways to serve our city, our county, our state, AND OUR NATION. Are we still continuing to make a difference? You bet!

Ask the kids from the Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth that held their education celebration in this club. Think about those children fighting critical illness at UMC that get a little joy from choosing their very own pillowcase made by our Evening Mesquite ladies and the children around the world serviced by Operation Smile that received our cloth dolls, "No No" armbands and happy fun hospital gowns made by our craft ladies.

Yes, we ARE continuing to make a difference in our community.

I am proud to be a member of the Mesquite Club and humbled that you would ask me to be President of this fine organization. I promise to work hard. We have a superb team and together we will make this a great year! Your president, Barbara Lacy

BOARD BRIEFS, CLUB FINANCIALS, MEMORIAL FUND, DUES REMINDER

BOARD BRIEFS

The May meeting of the Mesquite Club Executive Board was called to order by President Joan Powell at 10:08 A.M., May 7, 2013.

BUDGET: Colleen distributed copies of the proposed budget for the 2013-2014 club year. After a review and discussion of each line item, a motion to accept the proposed budget was made by Phyllis Hendrickson, seconded and passed.

BUILDING: Betty recommended the Mesquite Club hire A-1 Mechanical & Electric, the installer of the air conditioning units, to perform preventive maintenance. Phyllis Hendrickson made a motion to hire A-1 Mechanical for one year at the rate of \$1,301. The motion was seconded and approved.

BUILDING: Betty received two written bids from gardeners. Lois Evora made a motion to accept the bid from Land View for two visits per month at the cost of \$100 per month. The motion was seconded and approved.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: Lois Evora reviewed the accomplishments of the Community Services committee during 2012-2013. The Doris French Elementary School received books, school supplies, new and used computers and clothing for needy students. As a result of a very successful gala, a check for \$20,000 was also given to the school. Total donations were approximately \$25,000.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Cathi Poer said the round tables, purchased from the Assistance League, are now at the club house. After a discussion, Betty Rumford made a motion to allow Cathi to purchase a dozen, cloth, white, floor length tablecloths. The motion was seconded and passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:15 P.M.
