

February 3 Community Services Hands-On Projects guidelines:

<u>Pillowcase Project for Children with Cancer. (Visit conkerrcancer.org)</u> Please arrive at the clubhouse with the following supplies to cut and pin two pillow cases.

- 100% Cotton Fabric (use your imagination as far as patterns for little boys or girls)
- 1 ½ yard for the body.
- ½ yard for the cuff
- ½ yard for the accent piping

If you would only like to do one pillow case, just bring ½ the above yardage. Please bring scissors or a rotary cutter, a cutting map if you have one, cutting edges or yardsticks and straight pins. (We will do the sewing at a later date). If you would like a preview, see the U-Tube video entitled "Easy Tube Pillow Case Tutorial," "Pillow cases with Hidden Seams" or "How to Make a Pillowcase Burrito/Sausage Roll." We were introduced to this project a few years ago and it was so heartwarming to help provide smiles and comfort to children suffering from cancer. We won recognition from GFWC Nevada and GFWC International for our efforts.

- If you have material (can be cotton or polyester) or would like to purchase material that is more suited to adults, please bring that on February 3 and those pillow cases, when completed, will go the Delmar Gardens residents.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

The Mesquite Club Building Committee met recently to discuss building issues currently underway.

- Our large Mesquite Tree in front has been trimmed and cabled by a tree service and we hope to be able to save it. Other landscaping issues are being worked on, and some plant replacements and other needs will be taken care of as the weather warms.
- After our air conditioners were stolen last summer
 we realized we needed to better secure our building
 from the on-going theft attempts and general vandalism that takes place when the building is closed
 and there is no-one around. (Our storage area has
 had two break-ins over the last couple of weeks).
- We have gathered bids from wrought iron contractors for the gating of our driveways, and have now considered the three written bids we received. The Building Committee, Executive Board and the membership at the January business Meeting have accepted a bid from Western Iron to do the work of gating our driveways and front access to the court-yard. Access to these areas would be keyed, just like the gate to the front door. We would like to begin this work as soon as possible, but must now consider how to pay for it.

Western Iron has offered to donated some iron if we choose to fence-off the long low wall on the east side of our parking lot. For the front gate work the cost will be \$9500. If we do the additional work, using the donated iron, the estimate is an additional \$2500 making the total cost approximately \$12,000. This second part has not been priced yet, but we will have more information soon.

There are some funds available in our Memorial Fund, and also in our savings, but we will need to secure additional funds to do the total project. We have researched the availability of a grant for this without success. If anyone has contacts for possible donations, please contact the Building Chairman or our President. Donations to this project would be greatly appreciated! We will keep you up dated on the progress of this project.

MESQUITE CLUB PROPOSED BY-LAW AND STANDING RULE REVISIONS

MESQUITE CLUB PROPOSED BY-LAW AND STANDING RULE REVISIONS - JANUARY, 2015 ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS

SECTION 4: DUTIES

A. President

4. She shall appoint a director of the Executive Board to act as Advisor to the Evening Mesquite.

Proposed change: Delete. Renumber remaining items.

Rationale: An Advisor from the Executive Board is unnecessary as Evening Mesquite has a representative on the Executive Board who acts as liaison between Daytime & Evening.

ARTICLE VIII - DIRECTORS

SECTION 4: DUTIES

In the second sentence: There shall be at least one director on each of the following Committees: (1) Ways and Means Committee; (2) Community Service Committee; (3) Membership Committee, (4) Evening Mesquite Advisor.

Proposed change: After the words "There shall be at least one director" insert the words 'as advisor'; after the words "(3) Membership Committee" delete the remainder of the sentence.

Rationale: If the change to Article IV, Officers, Section 4: Duties, A. President. 4., is passed this section must also be changed for conformity; and to clarify the Directors' roles on the committees.

If passed the sentence would read: There shall be at least one director as advisor on each of the following Committees: (1) Ways and Means Committee; (2) Community Service Committee; (3) Membership Committee.

ARTICLE IX - EXECUTIVE BOARD

SECTION 4: MEETINGS

A. There shall be one mandatory meeting of the Executive Board each month during the year except July and August.

Proposed Change: After the word "year" place a period and delete the remainder of the sentence.

Rationale: The club must conduct business throughout the year and the long break between June and September makes it difficult to handle necessary business. The President and Executive Board can agree to dispense with a meeting if they deem it unnecessary.

If passed the sentence would read: A. There shall be one mandatory meeting of the Executive Board each month during the year.

STANDING RULES

6. In the third sentence: A book shall be placed in the Clark County Library or UNLV Library in memory of the member.

Proposed change: After the words "Clark County Library" delete the words "or UNLV Library".

Rationale: The club can no longer afford the minimum \$100.00 donation for each book that the UNLV Library requires.

If passed the sentence would read: A book shall be placed in the Clark County Library in memory of the member.

29. In the list of Elected Officers of the Evening Mesquite Club the second title from the end: "Communications Committee Chair"

Proposed Change: Delete this office title.

Rationale: This position no longer exists.

31. The Mesquite Club Treasurer shall establish an Evening Mesquite Community Services Fund category. This money shall be earned and disbursed at the direction of the Evening Mesquite membership.

Proposed Change: Delete the words "The Mesquite Club Treasurer shall establish an"; after the word "Services" delete the words "Fund category. This money"; before the words "Evening Mesquite" insert the word "The"; after the word "Services" insert the word "funds".

Rationale: This category already exists in the Treasurer's itemized categories. If passed the sentence would read: The Evening Mesquite Community Services funds shall be earned and disbursed at the direction of the Evening Mesquite membership.

REVISION NOTE: In recent publications of the Mesquite Bylaws some text has been inadvertently deleted, and since these are not changes the membership has voted on, these deletion errors need to be corrected and the text replaced in the next publication of the bylaws. These insertions do not need to be voted on, as they were never proposed to be changed. The two following sections will be corrected:

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 3: CLASSIFICATION

B. When a Mesquite member in good standing has attained the age of seventy (70), and has been a member for 35 years or more (in total), she can become a sustaining member by letter to the Executive Board. She shall pay one-half (1/2) of present dues. She retains all rights and privileges and shall have optional hostess obligations. **Note:** This was formerly Section 3, C. but when Section 3, B. was voted on to be deleted, this section then became 3, B.

ARTICLE XI -APPOINTIVE CHAIRS

SECTION 1: LIST OF APPOINTIVE CHAIRS

B. after the words "Memorial Fund," insert the word" Donations". **Note:** The position of Donations Chairman was not voted on to be removed, but was merely suspended during the 3-year Special Project for the Doris French Elementary School. A Donations Chair and Donations Committee have always been charged with the duty of proposing charitable entities to the membership for each club year's charitable donations.





\$ MESQUITE CLUB FINANCIAL STATEMENT \$



The meeting of the Mesquite Club Executive Board was called to order by President Ilene Baker at 10:07am.

President Elect: Johanna Kennedy; The six month report has been completed and emailed to President Baker. David Van Zantan will be the speaker on January 23. Entertainment for the Silver Tea will be the Las Vegas Academy of the Arts. Yvonne Kelly has our yearbook on a thumb drive. A copy of the drive will be obtained and additional books will be printed.

Ways and Means: Lois Evora; Various Ways and Means in December have netted \$1020. The Wine Tasting event raised approx. \$4100. Private Luncheon reservations are being taken anyone wishing to host a private luncheon please see Lois. Lois delivered approximately \$800 worth of clothing, games and books to Doris French ES for children in need at Christmas. Thank you to the Ways and Means Committee for all your hard work.

Community Service: Joan Lapan; March 27 is the next Community Service Luncheon. The committee will be meeting next week for planning. A recipe booklet with the Basque Lunch recipes will be produced and sold soon.

Nominating: Mary Gafford; Friday February 13 is the nominating committee meeting. Nominations are due in March with elections in April.

Building Committee: Cathi Poer; Wrought Iron Bids were received. One bid was selected by the committee. Western Iron provided a bid for \$9500 it is estimated that an additional \$2500 making the total cost approximately \$12,000.

The building committee recommended acceptance of the bid. The board approved the recommendation. Building committee recommendation for funding this project is to take \$3000 from the Memorial Fund and the remainder of funds to come equally from the savings account and from member donations. Discussion of working on obtaining a grant or contacting the City Commission. Cathy withdrew the funding recommendation and will research additional ways to fund. We had a recent vandalism event with a lock being cut and a gate being damaged at the rear of the building.

Director: Corinne Mewhirter – Evening Mesquite – Rummage Sale signups have started. Please sign up. Epic will be assisting with the clothing racks etc. Jewelry goes to Joan Doubrava; Good clothing goes to Sandy Holliday for Dress for Success.

Unfinished Business: Curio Cabinet on hold at Lynn World – Corinne will be picking this up to use for the rummage sale. Landscaping is still working on saving the Mesquite tree at the front. Ongoing consultation and work on beautification is being done. Joan Lapan suggested donating a few of our cookbooks to UNLV and UNR Library.
