PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

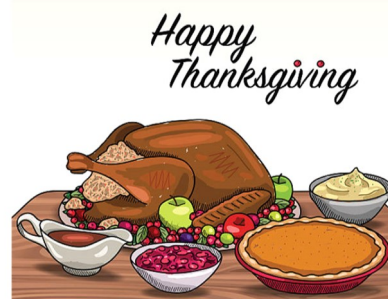
"Let us forget, not to be kind."

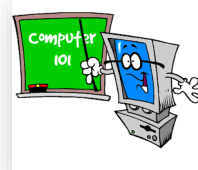

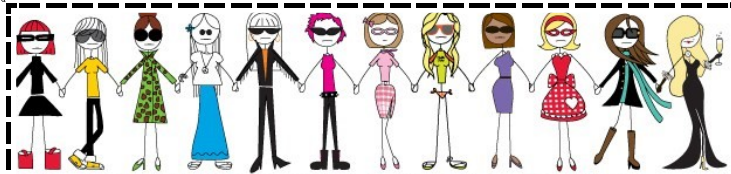
