

Deanna Beachley, Ph.D. will tell us about the Women's Suffrage Movement in Nevada



DeAnna Beachley teaches U.S. History and Women's Studies at the College of Southern Nevada.

She is currently working on a study of what happened to the National Woman's Party women who picketed the White House for the vote in 1917.





Jeanne passed away August 10, 2020, at the age of 83, was not born in Las Vegas, but most people in the community would never guess. She was a fierce champion, a long-time resident of Las Vegas and well-known community activist. According to former Nevada U.S. Senator Richard Bryan, "Jeanne Greenawalt was a civic leader known for her efforts to benefit the lives of neglected children, seniors and animals. Active in community service clubs, she was a founding member of the Junior Mesquite Club and Lifetime Achievement Award honoree with the Junior League of Las Vegas. Jeanne also successfully lobbied the Nevada Legislature for funding to build cottages for Child Haven."

Born in Newport, North Carolina, in 1936, Jeanne was a triplet and one of nine children. At 16, Jeanne and her two sisters Joan and June moved to Reno, Nevada, to live with their beloved sister, Dorothy Smith. A graduate of Reno High School, Jeanne attended the University of Nevada, Reno where she was a Theta. While there, she met her future husband, the late Forest "Frosty" Cahlan. After marrying into the Cahlan family, she relocated to Las Vegas in the mid-1950s and adopted the Las Vegas community. She spent the next 65 years determined to better the community.



Notes from your editor.


