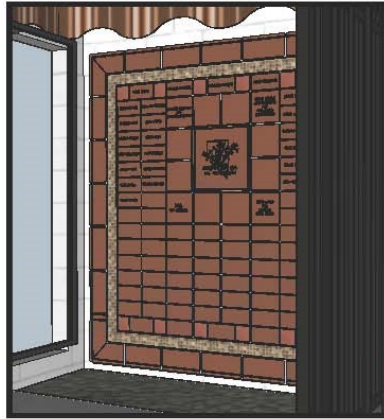

In an effort to celebrate "Make a Difference Day" celebrated nationwide on October 26, our Community Service Committee will support the **Freedom House**, the selected charity this year, by collecting in-kind items which will help the women living in the designated housing to succeed as they recover from alcohol or drug addiction and work toward sobriety and independent living. The residents are nearing the ability to be self-sufficient and live in the home with two "house mothers". All funds raised by the

Mesquite Club will go towards helping the women with rent money, food, clothes, personal items, and kitchen items. Our first **Community Service fundraiser Luncheon will be on November 1, 2019.**

The women living at the Freedom House are mentored to help them apply for jobs and continue to attend AA meetings. The usual time in residence is from one to four months.

The in-kind donations requested include:

- . Clothes, which could be used for interviews
- . Snacks, individual bags
- . Cleaning supplies for the upkeep of the house
- . Pots, pans, skillets, and some utensils for the kitchen
- . All paper products (Kleenex, paper towels, toilet paper)
- . Personal items (tampons, pads)
- . Grooming items (shampoo, soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes)
