WHAT'S THE BOARD UP TO? September 5, 2023

Members present: Frankie Segel, Sandra Ackerman, Colleen Bailey, Barbara Bolling, Cherie Williams DeWitt, Brenda Dupont, Sandra Holliday, Deloris Martinez, Sylvia Phillips, Jan White, Linda Zesiger. **Members absent:** Peggy Bruhns, Corrine Mewhirter, Cathi Poer, Mickey Pajor Chris White, Nancy Zangl.

Call to order: President Frankie Segel called the meeting to order at 10:05 AM with Barbara Bolling, acting temporarily as Recording Secretary. President Segel led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Minutes: The minutes of the Executive Board Meeting August 1, will be filed as submitted.

President's Report: President Segel reported we have several Board Members, unable to attend, therefore we will not have a quorum. She made mention of the many activities which have been scheduled for the year ahead, as well as speakers scheduled for meetings.

First Vice President: Sandra Ackerman reported she is having difficulty recruiting Tea Chairs for meetings and feel some of the members are thinking it is a huge commitment, but it isn't really.

Financial Secretary: Nancy Zangl's August Report was handed out, showing total income for August was \$4,521.46.

Building Chair: Cherie Williams DeWitt reported that a Building Committee Meeting was held on August 1. A multitude of building issues were addressed, and those recommendations made to the Board, included the following: Raising the price on rentals, which will be ratified at the next Board Meeting. Also, recommended are security cameras around the building, upgrading the sound system to Bluetooth, purchasing a defibrillator for the Clubhouse, obtaining bids on floor replacement of the bulging floor, looking into a new air conditioning service contract, and getting the broken door-dog replaced.

Ways & Means: Linda Zesiger reported three events will take place this year. The first is a soup and bake sale on Saturday, December 9, with the hope, that by holding it on Saturday, it will be easier to get more community attendance. Later a Chinese New Year Celebration in January, and third is a Wine Tasting in March. The Christmas in July mail was very successful.

Evening Representative: Delores Martinez reported they are trying to get the Club Office more organized. Cheryl Musser's husband built a new name badge rack. The HCA Committee are asking permission to attend two daytime meetings and have invitations available, as well as to sell raffle tickets. The Board consensus was in favor.

New Business:

1. Brenda Dupont reminded us of the opening luncheon on September 15, which will have a Western theme. Food will be purchased from Raising Cane's. Raising Cane's is providing raffle prizes. President Segel announced the Police Commander will be our guest speaker. Members are asked to bring socks for the homeless.

2. We are receiving applications for the Open Market, taking place on October 28.
